Vance County Emergency Operations Regional Generator Transfer Switch Grant Bid Response Summary

Vance County along with nine other counties received a regional grant award under the 2009 Homeland Security Grant Program.

This grant was for the purchase of manual transfer switches that would be installed at designated shelter locations through the region for the purpose of quickly connecting portable generator units.

The grant award is in the amount of \$200,000.00 and requires no local match of any kind.

This is a reimbursement style grant which requires us to spend the money first and then submit for reimbursement. The turnaround time should be less than 60 days.

The Vance County Board of Commissioners has already voted in favor of allowing Vance County to act as the fiduciary of the grant on behalf of the region.

Vance County Emergency Operations requested bids from electrical suppliers and contractors throughout the region and received six bid responses.

The bid responses consisted of the following:

Bid responses have been reviewed and we have contacted the low bidder to verify their response.

We are confident in their ability to provide the transfer switches in the time frame requested and that a quality product will be provided.

Additionally, we have requested that we be allowed to use the remainder of the grant funds to cover the cost of installing the switches at the designated shelter locations.

Presently our request is being considered and we hope to have an answer soon.

At this time, we are officially requesting the grant be awarded to Atlantic Power Solutions for the solution outlined in option 1 in the amount of \$98,056.00.

County Manager's Report

Vance County County Manager's Report to the Board December 5, 2011

- A. Register of Deeds Resolution. The Register of Deeds Office is currently working to duplicate and automate records. As part of the project, Register of Deeds Carolyn Pecora has determined the need to have 53 microfilm tapes of deeds of trusts copied offsite. The actual (paper) deeds of trusts will not be removed from the Register of Deeds, but the microfilm copies will be taken to the office of Logan Systems in Greensboro, NC for a period of time not to exceed December 6, 2011 through February 29, 2012. NC General Statues require that the Board of Commissioners approve the removal of public records for any period that exceeds 24 hours. Recommendation: Approve the accompanying resolution that authorizes the Register of Deeds to allow 53 microfilm copies of deeds of trust to be taken to the office of Logan Systems, Inc. in Greensboro, NC to be copied and returned on or before February 29, 2012.
- **B.** Surplus Waste Box. The County has an old 4 cubic yard solid waste box that is significantly rusted out beyond repair, has not been used for a number of years, and needs to be sold. *Recommendation:* Declare the 4 cubic yard solid waste box as surplus and authorize the Finance Director to sell it.
- C. Urgent Repairs CDBG Scattered Site Grant. According to Board policy for this program, the County Manager has the authority to approve repairs for urgent housing situations that cost no more than \$5,000 each. The policy requires a reporting of such repairs to the Board of Commissioners. In all three cases, three bids were obtained and the low bid was authorized to proceed with the required work. ① 266 West Andrews Avenue \$2,300 (remove remaining gutters, replace rotten boards, repair leaks, install handrail); ② 122 Watson Drive \$3,850 (total roof replacement); ③ 209 Pete Abbott Road \$3,850 (replace broken steps and install a handicap ramp). Recommendation: Receive as information.

Committee Reports and Recommendations

Vance County Committee Reports and Recommendations December 5, 2011

A. Human Resources Committee

Position Vacancies. (A) The Sheriff's Office has two position vacancies for a Deputy Sheriff. This position is crucial to ensure safety throughout Vance County. (B) Social Services has a position vacancy for a Social Worker IAT. This position is responsible for investigation/assessment and treatment of children and families based on the allegations that are reported to CPS. The vacancy limits the effectiveness of this mandated service being provided to the community. (C) Social Services has a position vacancy for a Child Support Agent II. This position is vital to the department in continuing to increase the amount of incentive money received from the Federal Government, collecting child support, and cost avoidance for children receiving Medicaid. Committee Recommendation: [Recommendations are contingent upon endorsement by the Human Resources Committee.] Authorize the staff to fill the vacant positions as requested.

B. Public Safety Committee

This Committee is scheduled to meet Thursday, December 1. A report of any recommendations will be provided to the full Board Monday evening as appropriate.

C. Joint Education Committee

The Joint Education Committee met on Monday, November 21, at the Schools Central Office. The following items were addressed:

Periodic Meetings. Consistent with both full boards, the committee members confirmed the need to commit to regular meetings. It was decided to meet quarterly to ensure ongoing discussion and communication. The value of the opportunity to review needs, concerns, and issues on an ongoing basis was emphasized.

Facility Tour. The Education representatives emphasized their desire for the two full boards to take a tour of the multi-purpose room construction in mid-December. The staffs were asked to poll the boards, starting with a proposed date of December 15. **Budget Planning for FY 2012-13.** Given the economic times, the committee agreed there is a need to begin early discussions of budget needs. The Superintendent stressed the desire of the Schools to apprise the County of its needs well in advance

Long-Term Facility Planning. In response to a request for long-range plans for school facilities, the Superintendent expressed a willingness to develop and provide five-year, ten-year, and fifteen-year facility plans.

Qualified Zone Academy Bonds. As previously outlined, in 2009 the two boards sought and obtained approval of 2009 Qualified Zone Academy Bonds (QZABs) in the amount of \$2 million, with the understanding that they cannot be activated until the County takes action to do so. This last batch of QZABs will expire 12/31/11 if not used; however, State officials have indicated a willingness to transfer the same amount of funding to the 2010 authority, thus providing a 12-month extension (until 12/31/12), pending a letter of request from the Schools. About half of the QZAB proceeds were designated for roof replacements at Dabney, Aycock, and Zeb Vance Elementary Schools, all of which had ten-year roofs. Those roofs now are between 16 and almost 20 years old now. Improvements at other schools were included in the funding application. With the 12-month extension, the County can better identify funding for the payback as current debt on the three schools will be paid off in the next two to three years, freeing up funds for the new QZAB repayment.

QZAB 2010 Authority

Aycock Elementary

- A. Roof replacement this facility is 17.8 years old and was constructed with a 10 year warranted roof. Over the years we have spent approximately \$22,450.00 in repairs however the interior of the building is continuously being compromised. We have experienced the rotting of cabinets and mold issues that resulted in involvement of NCDENR. The recommended and specified roof would be a 20 year system such as what was used on the Administrative Service Center in early 2011. Design and bid would be through DPI.
- B. Rekey interior locks based on the age of the school, wear on the devices and the fact that many people in the community have keys due to duplication of keys by local locksmiths the building security is also compromised. We currently employ a key system in about 50% of our schools that requires a key blank that cannot be purchased by others. The keys and cylinders are much more durable than what was originally installed due to newer technology.

Dabney Elementary

- A. Roof replacement this facility is 16.5 years old and was constructed with a 10 year warranted roof. Over the years we have spent approximately \$37,300.00 in repairs however the interior is continuously being compromised. The recommended and specified roof would be a 20 year system such as what was used on the Administrative Service Center in early 2011. Design and bid would be through DPI.
- B. Rekey interior locks based on the age of the school, wear on the devices and the fact that many people in the community have keys due to duplication of keys by local locksmiths the building security is also compromised. We currently employ a key system in about 50% of our schools that requires a key blank that cannot be purchased by others. The keys and cylinders are much more durable than what was originally installed due to newer technology.
- C. Masonry repairs and paint stress cracking has occurred throughout the building thus necessitating repairs and painting. This work has been evaluated and recommended by a PE at DPI.

Zeb Vance Elementary

- A. Roof replacement this facility is 19.25 years old and was constructed with a 10 year warranted roof. Over the years we have spent approximately \$27,250.00 in repairs however the interior of the building is continuously being compromised. The recommended and specified roof would be a 20 year system such as what was used on the Administrative Service Center in early 2011. Design and bid would be through DPI.
- B. Rekey interior locks based on the age of the school, wear on the devices and the fact that many people in the community have keys due to duplication of keys by local locksmiths the building security is also compromised. We currently employ a key system in about 50% of our schools that requires a key blank that cannot be purchased by others. The keys and cylinders are much more durable than what was originally installed due to newer technology.

E.O. Young Elementary

- A. Replace flooring and bleachers we continue to replace and repair portions of this asbestos tile floor, installing a floor system such as was specified for Clarke, E. M. Rollins, L. B. Yancey and New Hope would be environmentally and physically safer for kids.
- B. The bleachers are original equipment and do not meet any code or ADA requirements, this would be another step towards meeting the needs of our citizens.
- C. Install energy efficient windows in gym we have invested significant amounts of money to meet energy standards, the replacement of the single strength (1/16") glass would continue to increase comfort and contribute towards energy conservation.

Carver Elementary

- A. Install energy efficient windows when the 2003 Progress Energy project was implemented there was not enough money available to replace all of the windows, this will allow us to continue our energy conservation efforts.
- B. Paint inside of building this building was last painted in 2000 and is in dire need, paint is peeling off in sheets in the lobby.

L. B Yancey Elementary

A. Install energy efficient windows – when the 2003 Progress Energy project was implemented there was not enough money available to replace all of the windows, this project will allow us to continue our energy conservation efforts.

Eaton-Johnson Middle

- A. Paint inside of building this building has not been painted since it opened in 1999 after the bond renovation; it is in extremely poor condition.
- B. Rekey interior locks the keys and cylinders for this building are expensive to purchase and maintain; the keys have to be produced at the factory which encounters down time that often results in not being able to lock the door until a new key arrives. These keys and cylinders are only used at one other school and do not match anything else in the system.

Henderson Middle

A. Rekey interior locks — the keys and cylinders for this building are expensive to purchase and maintain; the keys have to be produced at the factory which encounters down time that often results in not being able to lock the door until a new key arrives. These keys and cylinders are only used at one other school and do not match anything else in the system.

Northern Vance High

- A. Install hand and guardrails there are areas in the courtyard that pose safety hazards to students and staff, this would correct these issues.
- B. Sandblast and paint exterior stairwells these were installed in 1995 and have not been completely re-painted since the original installation. This is a priority safety project.
- C. Replace ceilings and lights this is an on going project and most of what is in this building is 50 years old and is unsightly. It also makes the inside of the building darker and diminishes the learning environment.
- D. Replace outside windows and doors this is another on going project due to the massive size of the building, in some places the frames are so deteriorated they allow water to leak back into the building.
- E. Repair side and back parking lots the life expectancy of asphalt is 15-20 years, obviously this school has seen more than double these years. If we continue to ignore this project we will also have to replace the entire sub-base thus drastically increasing the overall cost.

Pending Business

Vance County

Pending Business December 2011

A. County Water Project. Phase 1A. City of Henderson staff have given their stamp of approval on the final plans and specifications. State USDA staff is currently reviewing the final plans and specifications. USDA RD has informed the engineer that the County can go to the bidding phase and ultimately to construction upon meeting the remaining requirements. The Phase 1A only agreement is for up to 150,000 gallons of water per day and does not include any provisions for operations and maintenance. An RFP for operations and maintenance services has been developed and will be advertised and distributed during the first week in December. Local permits have been obtained and right-of-way encroachment agreements for primary and secondary roads have been approved by NCDOT. NCDOT continues its review of encroachment agreements for interstate and controlled access highways. Permits are also currently being reviewed by NC DENR and it is anticipated that these reviews will be completed within the next few days. A site for an overhead water tank has been located and a formal agreement is being processed (per previous Water Board action). A meter vault site (i.e. tie-in point to City of Henderson water system) has been selected and work is underway to purchase the small site. With technical assistance from the engineer, the staff has begun to research the locations where additional private right-of-way and utility easements will be necessary from property owners. The associated title work and preparation of easement agreements are in process. Phase 1B. The Kittrell Water Association and USDA continue to work together to seek funding for Phase 1B, consistent with action taken by the Commissioners in December 2009. Phases 2A & 2B. Funding from USDA Rural Development has been established for both of these phases. Phase 2A will be funded with \$2.2 million in loans and \$1.62 million in grants. Phase 2B has \$3.94 million in loans and \$1.99 million in grants. Highway right-of-way encroachment agreements with NC DOT have been prepared for execution. Sign-ups continue to be received for the two phases. Through special funding, an engineering firm, Dewberry & Davis, conducted doorto-door sign-ups in June, starting with Thomas Road and working other roads in the general area as designated by Hobbs & Upchurch. Initial indications from that work show that additional sign-ups will be essential in order to have enough of a concentrated customer base to effectively redesign the project. Due to the nature of the funding of Phases 2A & 2B, it will be important that work on these phases begin as soon as possible after Phase 1A work is underway. A water purchase agreement with the City will need to be negotiated for these two phases together.


