## REPORT TO VANCE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MARCH 12, 2012

1. Vance County Regional Farmers Market Committee Membership

The Committee respectfully requests approval of the updated membership list, included in your packet.

2. Saturday Farmers Market for the 2012 Season

The Committee recommends that in 2012, the Saturday Vance County Farmers Market be held at the Henderson City Operations Center on Beckford Drive (tentative approval obtained from City). The reasons are as follows:

- The City Operations Center is in close proximity to the site of the future farmers market. Customers will begin to get used to visiting the market in the new area.
- Customer and vendor numbers from 2011 season indicate that the Saturday market in its current location is underutilized. Currently the Wednesday market at the YMCA has almost triple the customers, vendors, and sales of the Saturday location. The Committee believes that, based on patterns at other markets around the state, Saturday customer and vendor numbers will increase dramatically at the Operations Center location.
  - O Williams/Arch St.: Average 4 vendors per week, 46 customers per week, \$4700 in sales for the season
  - YMCA: Average 11 vendors per week, 134 customers per week, \$17,000 in sales for the season
- 3. Updates on the New Farmers Market Facility
  - Architect is working on the site plan.
  - Ceremonial Groundbreaking scheduled for March 23<sup>rd</sup>.
  - Two pending grant applications seeking additional funds for construction.

#### Vance County Cooperative Extension 2011 Program Impact Report March, 2012

Vance County's environment of assets and needs provides rich opportunity for Cooperative Extension's educational programming. 2011 programming targeted the following issues:

- Profitable and Sustainable Agriculture Systems
- Safety and Security of our Food and Farm Systems
- Volunteerism
- Parenting Skills
- Healthy Eating and Physical Activity
- Natural Resources Conservation and Environmental Sustainability
- Urban and Consumer Agriculture

The 4-H program has achieved success in collaborating with Vance County Schools to provide several enrichment activities. The 4-H/Master Gardener Volunteers partnership continues to use the 4-H Soil Solutions curriculum with third graders in two elementary schools and is expanding that program. Health Rocks, the drug awareness and prevention program, has been enthusiastically received by two public middle schools. And an after school 4-H robotics club was organized at one local high school to participate in the JC Penney sponsored project.

A robust summer program served 130 youth. Two weeklong foods and nutrition series were outstanding features of that program. The Jr. Iron Chefs on a Shoestring targeted middle schoolers and Dancin' in the Kitchen targeted youth nine through 12. Arnetta Wilson, Extension's Area Expanded Foods and Nutrition Program assistant taught the nutrition component of both of these series. This included menu planning, food preparation, and physical activity. The Jr. Iron Chef's program included the additional components of etiquette, financial management, sewing, and crafts.

During 2011 the 4-H agent added two advisory committees, a program advisory group and a teen council, charged with improving and increasing 4-H outreach in the community. The teen council will also identify and implement service projects in the county.

The 4-H livestock program offered youth, both members and non-members, multiple activities. The Four County 4-H Pullet Show and Sale was established. Skillathon teams were trained. A Livestock Extravaganza was held to market the 4-H livestock program. Other opportunities for youth to show and/sell their animals included the Four County Livestock Show and Sale, the Vance County Regional Fair, and The NC State Fair.

Program efforts in agriculture and natural resources have addressed production, safety, and marketing. The annual Farm-City celebration was continued with a well-received breakfast event sponsored by Farm Bureau. A cabbage field day was held at a local farm growing 250,000 heads of cabbage on previous tobacco acreage.

Vance Extension partnered with the NC Agromedicine Institute to offer testing and training to meet the new fumigant regulations. Workshops trained growers on strategies including high tunnels, transplant production, pest control, plant selection and installation, and maintenance. Staff has been assisted by Master Gardener Volunteers in providing education through clinics and media. Farmers and homeowners have reported implementing practices such as high tunnels, soil sampling, efficient irrigation, and reducing pesticide use.

A forest landowners program has served over 100 owners. With help from partners including NCSU Extension Forestry, NRCS, USDA Farm Service Agency, and the Division of Forest Resources, programs on cost-share programs, selling timber, tax issues, and forest management were presented. Landowners reported controlling vegetation, constructing firebreaks, using mapping software, obtaining a forest management plan, and applying for the present use taxation program. The average value of economic benefits received as a result of Extension's educational programs was \$1185, for a total value for all participants of approximately \$120,000.

Vance Extension staffers have continued efforts to maintain a vibrate farmers' market venue while working to establish a new, regional multi-purpose facility. Two small markets have served 30 vendors and 4770 consumers during the 2011 season that extended from June through December. Vendors reported selling \$22,000 worth of fruits, vegetables, flowers, baked goods, and crafts.

In addition, great progress was made toward the goal of building a first class regional farmers market in Vance County. This included the \$300,000 grant from the NC Tobacco Trust Fund Commission and the \$150,000 purchase of one acre of land by the Vance County Farm Bureau. Landowners, Northpark Associates, donated an additional eight acres valued at \$500,000 (appraisal conducted by Wolff Appraisal Services). Cooperative Extension continues to actively pursue other funds to cover the remaining construction costs. *Pending grant applications include \$100,000 from the NC Agricultural Development and Farmland Preservation Trust and \$392,000 from the NC Tobacco Trust Fund Commission.* 

Family and Consumer Sciences programming focused on food preservation, the Vance County Extension and Community Association (ECA), and parenting education, which is seen by Vance citizens as the priority issue to address. The Vance County Parenting Task Force, facilitated by the Vance County Extension Director, sponsored six parenting class series in 2011. Parenting Matters, an eight-week series, targets referred and court mandated parents. The Five County Mental Health Authority's Prevention Specialist, a task force member, conducted three series completed by 27 parents. Part-time parenting educators employed by Extension and funded by Franklin, Granville, Vance Smart Start, Inc. facilitate the intensive 16-week Incredible Years Training for parents of preschoolers. 15 parents participated in the three series completed in 2011. (Cooperative Extension has applied to the NC Department of Social Services for a grant award of \$77,614 for each of three years, totaling \$232,842 to expand The Incredible Years to parents of children six through 11). Home food preservation demonstrations stressing use of pressure canner, food safety, and preservation techniques were presented to 15 participants.

ECA programming strived for education, fun, and fellowship to meet its educational mission as well as keep and attract members. Programming has included heart health, indoor air quality, e-Conservation, breast health, food preparation, and home organization. ECA members are charged with the responsibility of sharing the research-based information they learn with others- family, neighbors, and other organizations to which they belong. The group has also continued its 30 plus year service project of nursing home visitation and support.

Vance County Cooperative Extension staffers reported face-to-face contacts with 9,429 persons and non face-to-face contacts with another 19,194 persons, not including media contacts. Their efforts netted \$360,950.00 in grants and donations. Over 100 Extension volunteers contributed 1,200 plus hours of time with a value of approximately \$25,000.

#### Mother "testifies" for Smart Start

Marquita joined the Cooperative Extension parenting educator and county director at the Smart Start Allocations Committee to stress the importance of continued Smart Start funding of The Incredible Years (IY) parenting program. She admitted that she had been an unwilling participant referred by the Vance County Department of Social Services. She reported that she hit, yelled and cursed at her three preschoolers. As a result her children did the same. She had no idea she needed to play with her children or praise them. Marquita learned to reduce her use of profanity, to use positive discipline practices and ignore behaviors that were not harmful. IY facilitators observed improved behaviors in Marquita and her children, especially how they listened to her as she spoke calmly and respectfully to them. She honestly described her children's and her prior behaviors and pleaded with the committee to continue funding the program because of the difference it made in her family's life and it could make in the lives of other families like hers.

#### 4-H Spotlight



Vance County middle school teachers participate in the three-legged "Addiction Race" as part of their training in the 4-H Health Rocks! curriculum. The activity brings home to students how addictions hold them back in life.

In November, two curriculum specialists from the NC 4-H state office and the Vance Co. 4-H agent trained 11 area middle school teachers to implement the 4-H curriculum *Health Rocks!*, a substance abuse prevention curriculum that educates youth on the dangers of substance abuse and teaches them the refusal skills needed to make healthier choices for themselves. From Nov. 21 to Dec. 20, 2011, 186 students at Eaton Johnson and almost 300 students at Henderson Middle School received 10 hours of instruction in *Health Rocks!*.

The Southern Vance 4-H Robotics Club attended the FIRST Robotics Kickoff on Jan. 7 at Dorton Arena in Raleigh. JC Penney provided a \$6,500 grant to Vance County 4-H to make this opportunity available to students at Southern Vance High School. NC 4-H provided an additional \$1,000 from its STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) fund for the project. Club members will build a robot to compete in the NC FIRST Robotics competition in April.

## 2011 FORESTRY SEMINARS A GREAT SUCCESS

Forest landowners in Vance and Warren Counties are in need of accurate, up-to-date information that will help them get maximum value from their forest resources. To meet that need, Cooperative Extension provides a comprehensive educational program consisting of seminars, tours, e-mail updates, and individual consultations. There were approximately 100 participants in 2011 educational programs. Key partners included NCSU Extension Forestry, NRCS. USDA Farm Service Agency, and the Division of Forest Resources. In a year-end program survey, over 75% of respondents indicated that they had gained knowledge about important forest management topics such as cost-share programs. selling timber, tax issues, and forest management. Furthermore, 50% of respondents implemented practices such as controlling vegetation. constructing fire breaks, and using mapping software. Five people obtained a forest management plan, and four applied for the present use taxation program. The average value of economic benefits received as a result of Extension's educational programs was \$1185, for a total value for all participants of approximately \$120,000.

#### Vegetable Production Meeting

Vance County small farmers wanted to extend their vegetable production season to provide more vegetables for their families, and increase the profitability of their farms. Cooperative Extension addressed this need by conducting a meeting entitled Production Of Vegetables In High Tunnels And Season Extension. The 11 small farmers were surveyed post meeting and all had increased their knowledge about the types of vegetables that can be grown in high tunnels, and methods of extending the growing season using high tunnels and row covers. Four small farmers were surveyed verbally in December 2011. Mrs. Magnolia H. Williams who had built a high tunnel using the A&T grant funds, increased her income approximately \$300 by using the high tunnel method. Three additional farmers are ordering high tunnels.

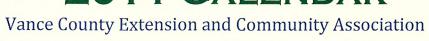

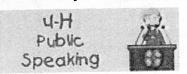

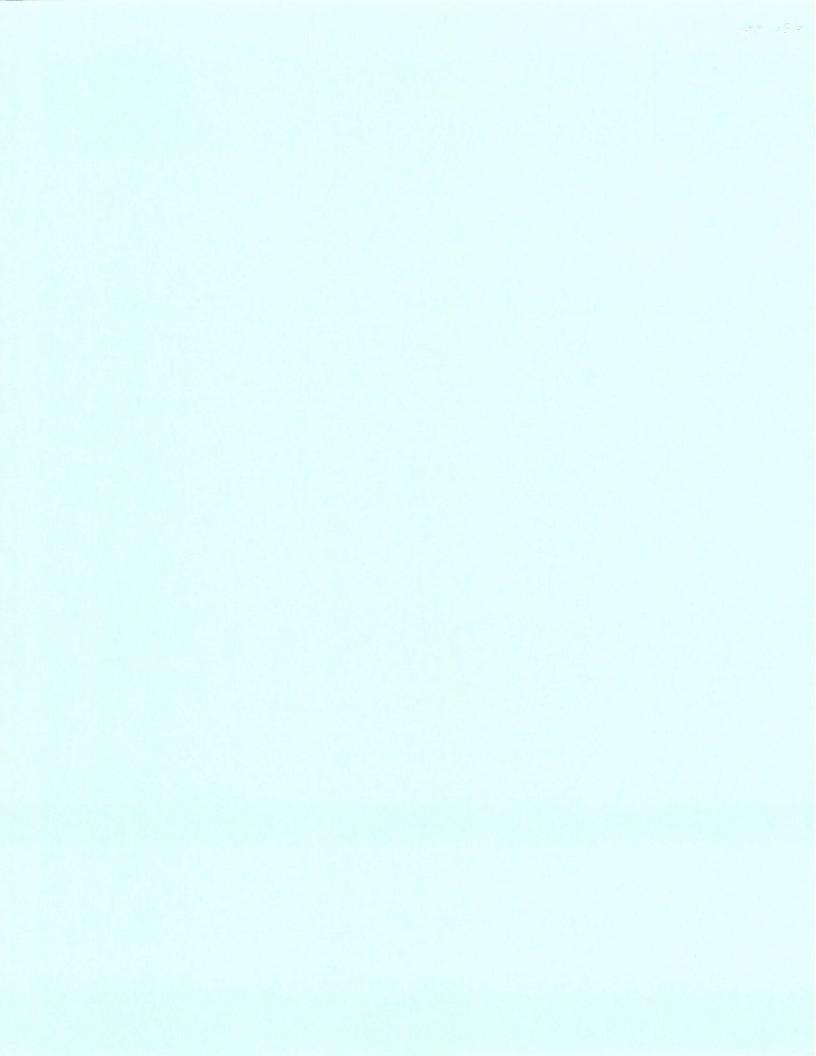

4-H EFNEP Vance County Report

The Expanded Food and Nutrition Education Program (EFNEP), serves limited-resource families with young children, school-age youth, and pregnant teens through a series of lessons offered by paraprofessionals and volunteers, many of whom are indigenous to the population. Using "hands-on" experiences, participants are taught to: make wise choices with their food dollars, improve eating habits, and practice food safety principles.

EFNEP is offered through North Carolina Cooperative Extension as a part of university outreach at NC State University and NC A&T State University. In 2011, North Carolina EFNEP served 48 counties.

EFNEP's mission is to assist families and youth with limited resources in making simple changes in eating behaviors and daily physical activity so that, over time, healthy choices become healthy habits.

## 4-H EFNEP Teaches Youth the Importance of Clean Hands

Keeping hands clean is one of the most effective ways to keep ourselves from getting sick and spreading germs and viruses to others. Nearly 22 million school days a year are lost due to the common cold, according to the Center for Disease Control. A study of school children showed that washing hands at least 4 times a day can reduce stomach illnesses by more than 50 percent. Eighty percent of all infections get transmitted by the hands.



To address this issue, the Vance County
Cooperative Extension's 4-H Expanded Food and Nutrition Education Program (4-H EFNEP) offers a series of lessons on nutrition, exercise and the Fight Bac rules to limited resource school-aged youth. This past summer, 4-H EFNEP partnered with the 4-H Agent in the county to offer a Summer Day Camp. During the 4-H EFNEP nutrition lessons, the program assistant used a lotion called glow germ to help the youth understand the importance of handwashing and how quickly bacteria and viruses can spread. The glow germ glows under a black light and helps illustrate when hands have not been washed thoroughly as well as where the lotion or "pretend bacteria" have spread. The lotion was applied to each youth's hands and a black light was used to show them what the "pretend bacteria" looked like before and after washing their hands. The youth could also clearly see how bacteria that they can't see gets on their hands each day and how it spread very quickly to everything they touched. Many were surprised at the amount of lotion that was left on their hands after washing. Out of the 13 students in attendance only 3 students had completely clean hands after the demonstration. The consensus was that they wanted to repeat this demonstration to see if they improved after practicing proper hand washing techniques. This time 12 out of the 13 total students had clean hands.

The youth concluded that the more they practiced proper handwashing, the better they would become. They stated that they were very concerned about staying well and having clean hands. Each of the participating youth pledged to remind each other of the importance of proper handwashing. As a group, they set a goal to practice proper handwashing every day.

As a result of what they learned through 4-H EFNEP, these youth not only have very clean hands, but they have also reduced their risk of illness.

#### Overview

FROM:

Recently there has been a goal and a focused effort within the Planning and Development Department to become customer friendly and to ultimately simplify a complex permitting process. In order to carry out the objectives of this goal it has become necessary to review and update the fee schedule for the Inspections division.

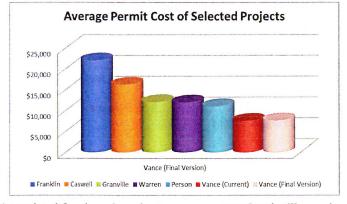
Currently the method of determining commercial permit fees is based upon complex formulas that change depending on the situation, occupancy and/or project presented. Because of this the department is unable to give good pricing estimates ahead of receiving all of the plans and completing a thorough review. This method of proceeding is not consistent with the Departments goals for being customer friendly. Additionally with the current format of the permit fees it will be very difficult to transition to updated permitting software in the future.

## Methodology and fee comparisons

In reviewing permit fees in North Carolina and particularly in the Kerr-Tar Region there are two approaches that take precedence for commercial projects. The first being based upon square footage and the other being based upon

job cost. Within the Kerr-Tar Region the simplest method for the citizens and the most predominant method used is based upon job cost. As a result, the proposed method for Vance County utilizes job cost and does away with the complex formula based method.

While completing the fee comparisons it was determined that Vance County fees for commercial projects were significantly lower than all of the counties in the region. Most of the other counties have made updates to their fee schedules within that last few years and therefore Vance County's fees are out of date. Based upon



comments from the Board at the Planning Retreat the updated fees have been kept revenue neutral and still remain at the lowest in the region. (See attached fee comparisons for selected projects in Vance County)

In addition to making the fundamental change in fee calculation method for commercial projects, the other changes include the following:

- 1. Single Family Homes Continues use of calculation based upon square footage, but groups into categories thus doing away with complex formula and simplifying process; Costs held constant after change.
- 2. Modular Homes no longer separate category included with single family residential;
- 3. Residential additions/remodel use set fee instead of formula;
- 4. Creates a fixed base fee for residential accessory buildings and swimming pools;
- 5. Creates a reduced fee for intact homes moved onto lots;
- 6. Creates a reduced fee for Mechanical change outs with no ductwork (i.e. large mechanical equipment);
- 7. Shingle permits changed to a single flat fee for either residential or commercial;

#### Request

In order to assist the Planning and Development Department in its goal of becoming customer friendly and in simplifying the permit fee schedule, it is respectfully requested that the Board consider the attached fee schedule as a revision to the Department's permit fee schedule and policy. The attached fee schedule presents the fee information in a simplified form with limited overall changes to the fees.

**SURROUNDING LAND USE:** This property is surrounded by agricultural residential uses and primarily vacant land with scattered homes. The property is in close proximity to other R-30 zoned areas and low density residential is characteristic of the area.

**SIZE:** The proposed lot size would be 0.689 acres or 30,000 square feet. The rezoning will allow this smaller lot size. If approved the remaining acreage of the parent tract would be approximately 39.8 acres by deed.

**EXISTING LAND USE**: The parent parcel is

currently agricultural residential in nature with approximately 50% wooded and 50% grassland. An existing lot has been cut from the parent tract and is zoned R-30 currently and includes a single family dwelling. As a part of this request that existing R-30 designation is mapped incorrectly and will be shifted to the west to encompass the lot that has the existing single family dwelling.

**ZONING HISTORY**: All lots to date in this area have been zoned as they were since countywide zoning was established in late 2011.

**OTHER SITE CHARACTERISTICS:** This property is not located in a water supply watershed; therefore, there are no impervious coverage restrictions.

## **IMPACTS**

This rezoning appears to have minimal if any impacts on traffic, schools, or fire/EMS related impacts.

## **REQUIRED REVIEWS BY OTHER AGENCIES**

**LOCAL:** The applicant will have to provide a site plan to the Planning & Development Department for review prior to developing the property. Zoning requirements will be reviewed as such time. Building code review will take place at a later time when development plans are submitted.

## STAFF COMMENTS AND PLANNING BOARD RECOMMENDATION

The site is designated as Agricultural Residential and is not located in any identified neighborhood areas, development communities or areas as identified in the Land Use Plan. The character of this area is predominantly Agricultural-Residential with scattered areas of low density residential development. The proposed lot would be suitable for residential development and would be better protected from incompatible developments if rezoned as R-30. This rezoning would also permit for the minimum lot size to be reduced from 1 acre to 0.689 acres.

The rezoning request appears to be consistent with the County land use plan in that it satisfies the promotion and encouragement of additional housing construction while also protecting natural areas from development.

PLANNING BOARD RECOMMENDATION: Made March 8, 2012

**Draft Rationale for Board of Commissioners Approval**: The rezoning is consistent with the land use plan while permitting the landowner to benefit from uses which are not permitted within the current zoning. Further, nominal if any disturbance is expected for neighbors. The permitted uses within the proposed zoning are similar in nature to the current zoning, which will maintain the overall character and use. within the area.

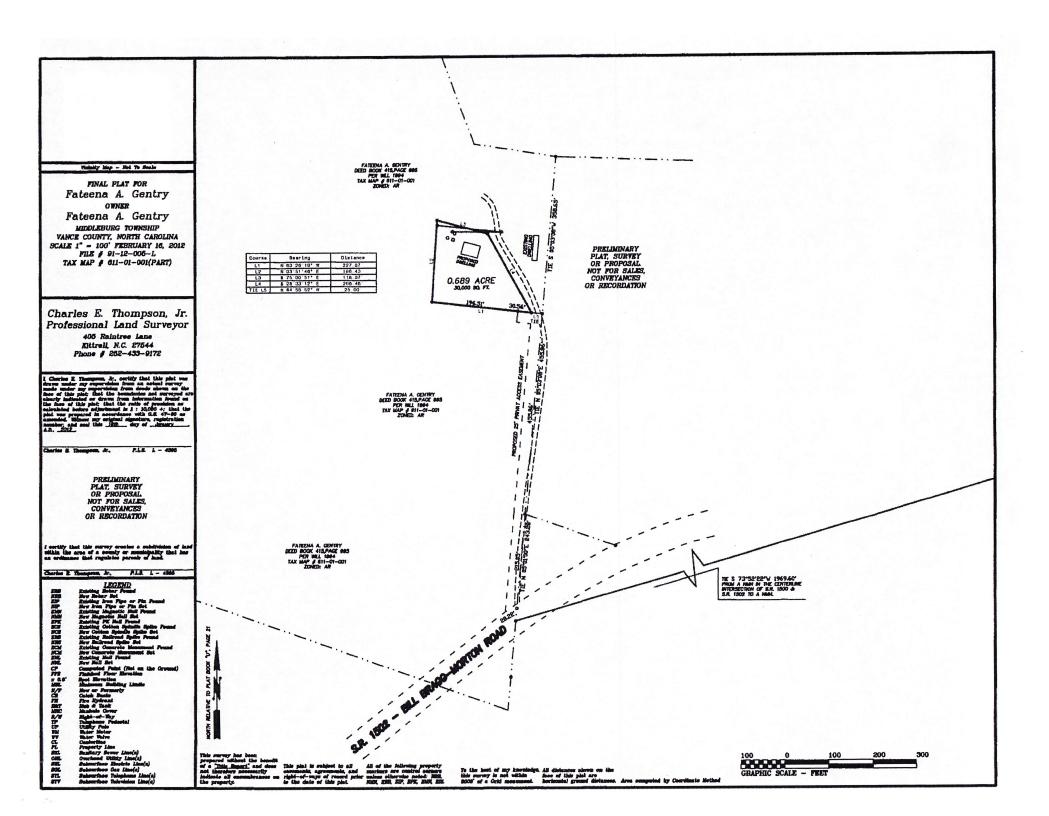

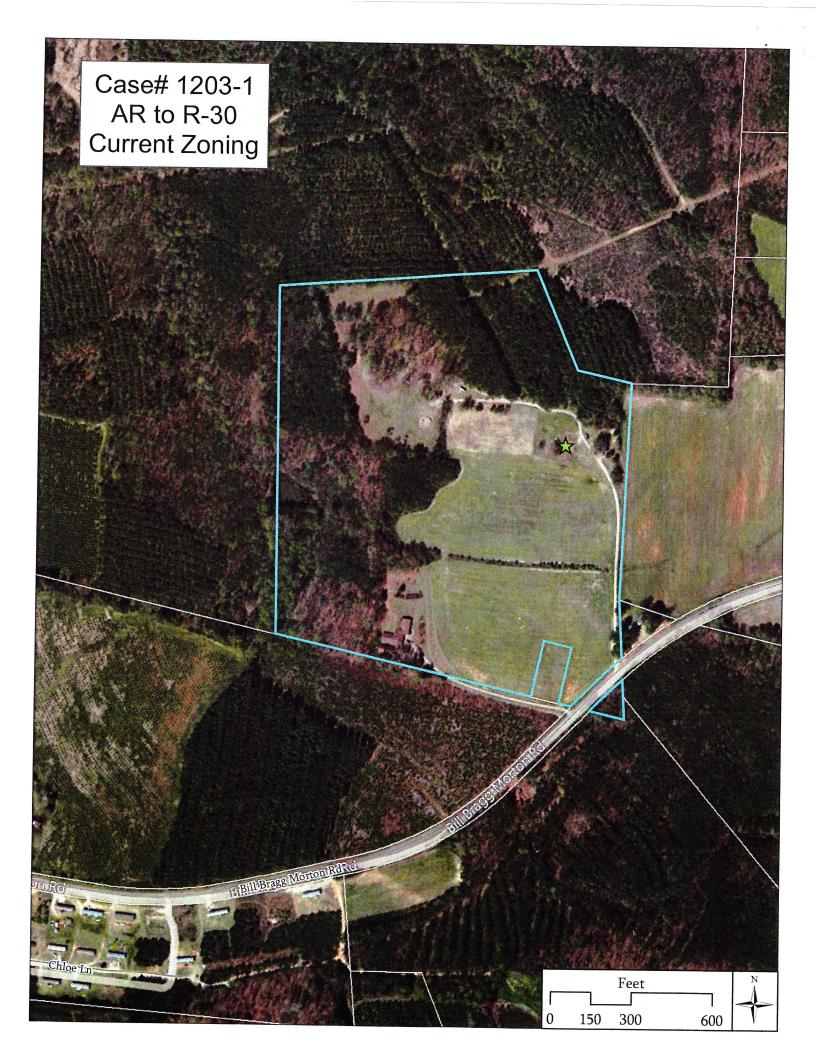

#### **EXPLANATION OF THE REQUEST**

This is a request to amend the zoning map and to rezone a lot to be consistent with the zoning of the adjacent parcel of land, all under common ownership and use. The lot to be rezoned (12.32 acres) is identified as 151 Stagecoach Road or more specifically as tax parcel 0365-03012 and includes an existing 11,960 sq. foot mini storage facility (constructed prior to implementation of zoning) which is partially construction on this tract as well as the Owners adjoining tract. The amendment is requested to change the current tracts zoned Agricultural Residential (A-R) and Residential Low Density (R-30) to a Light Industrial (LI) zoning designation for the entire parcel to match its current, pre-existing use. The property owner is requesting the rezoning to fix a non-conforming situation (portion of a building is zoned differently). The current use of the existing building is permitted within the LI zoning district.

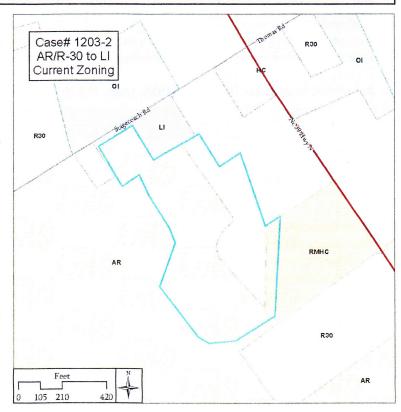

## PROPERTY INFORMATION

**LOCATION:** 151 Stagecoach Road Road; more specifically identified as tax parcel number 0365-03012.

**EXISTING LAND USE:** The parcel is currently split between two zoning categories (AR and R-30). Following a 2006 survey of the property, the former boundary lines were changed and thus it is necessary to adjust the zoning designations for consistency. There is an existing storage building (roughly 11,960 sq. feet) on the property along Stagecoach Road and is wooded on the rear of the property. This request will permit the zoning and the current preexisting use to be consistent. The proposed amendment is also consistent with the zoning district and the land use plan.



**SURROUNDING LAND USE:** Because of this property's location in a crossroads community (identified as a Williamsboro Development Area) on the current land use map, this area is characterized by various uses. Closer to the intersection of Stagecoach Road and NC 39 North there are parcels zoned Highway Commercial and Office-Institutional. Moving away from the intersection the land becomes more residential and agricultural in nature as is common next to development areas. This particular area to be rezoned is adjacent to an area zoned Light Industrial and the existing building is split between the Light Industrial zoning and the Agricultural-Residential zoning.

**SIZE:** The parcel is 12.32 acres.

**ZONING HISTORY**: All lots to date in this area have been zoned as they were since countywide zoning was established in late 2011.

**OTHER SITE CHARACTERISTICS:** This property is not located in a water supply watershed.

## **IMPACTS**

This rezoning appears to have minimal if any impacts on traffic, schools, or fire/EMS related impacts.

## STAFF COMMENTS AND PLANNING BOARD RECOMMENDATION

The rezoning request is consistent with the land use plan and will amend the zoning map to reflect the actual property. The use of the existing structure is consistent with the proposed zoning category and a non-conforming situation will be eliminated.

The area is characteristic of mixed uses particularly as it is within the Williamsboro Development Area. Staff recommends approval of the rezoning request and advises that if future development takes place the current zoning ordinance will require that appropriate buffers and screens be provided and maintained between the property and surrounding residential areas.

PLANNING BOARD RECOMMENDATION: Made March 8, 2012

Draft Rationale for Board of Commissioners Approval: The original intention of drawing zoning boundaries utilized existing parcel boundaries and existing uses. Based upon this, there is justification to allow the rezoning thereby amending the zoning map. The rezoning is reasonable, will prevent an existing building from having split zoning, and is consistent with the land use plan for development communities/crossroad areas.

**Re:** Planning board rezoning recommendations

Board of Commission members,

The planning board met during their regular monthly meeting on Thursday, March 8, 2012 and considered two rezoning requests. In accordance with requirements this letter serves as formal written notice of the planning board's recommendations concerning the rezoning cases.

Case#RZ1203-1 – Rezoning of proposed lot from A-R to R-30 along Bill Bragg Morton Road: Applicant has withdrawn the request – no need for Board of Commissioner consideration. The planning board recommendation was to deny the rezoning request. The planning board questioned the applicant's reasoning for wanting a smaller lot size and for requesting the rezoning. The recommendation was based upon the idea that the purpose of the agricultural-residential zoning category is to preserve agricultural areas and rezoning to R-30 would be in conflict with that idea. The planning board pointed out in their recommendation that if the rezoning were approved it may set a precedent for situations where property owners see an opportunity to use rezoning for creating reduced lot sizes in predominantly agricultural areas.

Case#RX1203-2 – Rezoning of 151 Stagecoach Road (Tax Parcel 0365-03012): The planning board recommended approval of this rezoning request. The recommendation was based upon the original intention that was used in drawing the zoning boundaries utilizing existing parcel boundaries and existing uses. With this intention there is justification for allowing the amendment to the zoning map. Additionally the planning board found the rezoning to be consistent with the land use plan while preventing an existing building and use from having split zoning.

The recommendations as presented above are consistent with the planning board's recommendations following review at their previously scheduled regular meeting. The Draft rationale for the Board of Commissioner's approval as presented in the staff report is consistent with the Planning Board's recommendation for the second case.

- **A. Resolution Authorizing Water Bonds.** In order to issue the water bonds (bond anticipation notes), the Water District Board must approve the resolution as prepared by bond counsel. *Recommendation:* Adopt the required resolution providing for the issuance of \$5,627,000 of water bond anticipation notes.
- **B. Selection of Operations and Maintenance Services Provider.** A solicitation for requests for proposals (RFPs) to provide operations and maintenance services for the water project was undertaken in January. The engineer will make his recommendation based on the two responses that were received. *Recommendation:* Approve the selection of the firm recommended by the engineer to provide operations and maintenance services to the Vance County Water District.
- C. Award of Construction Bids. Water line construction bids were received, reviewed, and readied for recommendation by the engineer. As a means of encouraging smaller companies to bid, the construction work (excluding the storage tank) was divided into two components. Water storage tank construction is a highly specialized field; thus, it was bid out separately. There is a total of three bids to be awarded. The engineer will make his recommendations to the Board. Recommendation: Award the bids as recommended by the engineer, subject to the water bond anticipation notes being duly approved and issued by the Local Government Commission.
- **D.** Capital Project Ordinance. One of the requirements to issue water bonds is for the Water District Board to formally adopt a capital project ordinance. The ordinance is being developed and will be made available as soon as it is complete. **Recommendation:** Adopt the capital project ordinance as submitted by the Finance Director.
- E. Other Matters if Required.

# RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$5,627,000 WATER BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners for the County of Vance, North Carolina, in its capacity as the governing body of the Vance County Water District (the "District"):

Section 1. The Board has determined and does hereby find and declare as follows:

- (a) An order authorizing \$27,000,000 Water Bonds of the District was adopted by the Board for the District on March 10, 2008, which order was approved by the vote of a majority of the qualified voters of the District who voted thereon at a referendum duly called and held on May 6, 2008.
  - (b) None of said bonds has been issued.
- (c) It is necessary to issue \$5,627,000 notes at this time in anticipation of the receipt of the proceeds of the sale of a like amount of bonds.

Section 2. In anticipation of the receipt of the proceeds of the sale of a like amount of bonds, the issuance of \$5,627,000 negotiable notes of the District is hereby authorized, which notes shall be designated "Water Bond Anticipation Notes" (the "Notes"), shall be dated May 1, 2012, shall mature January 30, 2013, without option of prior payment, and shall bear interest at a rate to be determined by the Local Government Commission at the time the Notes are sold,

which interest shall be payable at the maturity of the Notes, on the basis of a 360-day year consisting of twelve 30-day months, to which no interest coupons shall be attached.

In the event that the Finance Officer of the District determines that an amount less than \$5,627,000 is required to carry out the purposes for which the Notes are being issued, the Finance Director is hereby authorized to reduce the principal amount of the Notes at or before the time of opening of the bids for the Notes.

The principal of and the interest on the Notes shall be payable in any coin or currency of the United States of America which is legal tender for the payment of public and private debts on the respective dates of payment thereof.

The Notes shall be issued by means of a book-entry-only system with no physical distribution of Note certificates to be made except as hereinafter provided. One Note certificate in the aggregate principal amount of the Notes stated to mature on January 30, 2013 and registered in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee of The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York ("DTC"), shall be issued and deposited with DTC and immobilized in its custody. The book-entry-only system will evidence ownership of the Notes in the principal amount of \$100,000 and integral multiples of \$1,000 in excess of \$100,000, with transfers of ownership effected on the records of DTC and its participants pursuant to rules and procedures established by DTC and its participants. The principal of and interest on the Notes shall be payable to Cede & Co. or any other person appearing on the registration books of the District hereinafter provided for as the registered owner of the Notes or his registered assigns or legal representative at such office of the Note Registrar hereinafter mentioned or such other place as the District may determine upon the presentation and surrender thereof as the same shall become due and payable; provided, however, that for so long as the Notes are deposited with DTC, the payment of the principal of and interest on the Notes shall be made to DTC in same-day funds by 2:30 p.m. or otherwise as determined by the rules and procedures established by DTC. Transfer of principal and interest payments to participants of DTC will be the responsibility of DTC, and transfer of principal and interest payments to beneficial owners of the Notes by participants of DTC will be the responsibility of such participants and other nominees of such beneficial owners. The District will not be responsible or liable for such transfers of payments or for maintaining, supervising or reviewing records maintained by DTC, its participants or persons acting through such participants.

In the event that (a) DTC determines not to continue to act as securities depository for the Notes or (b) the Finance Officer of the District determines that continuation of the book-entry only system of evidence and transfer of ownership of the Notes would adversely affect the interests of the beneficial owners of the Notes, the District will discontinue the book-entry only system with DTC. If the District identifies another qualified securities depository to replace DTC, the District will make arrangements with DTC and such other depository to effect such replacement and deliver replacement Notes registered in the name of such other depository or its nominee in exchange for the outstanding Notes, and the references to DTC or Cede & Co. in this resolution shall thereupon be deemed to mean such other depository or its nominee. If the District fails to identify another qualified securities depository to replace DTC, the District will deliver replacement Notes in the form of fully-registered certificates in denominations of \$100,000 and integral multiples of \$1,000 in excess of \$100,000 ("Certificated Notes") in

exchange for the outstanding Notes as required by DTC and others. Upon the request of DTC, the District may also deliver one or more Certificated Notes to any participant of DTC in exchange for Notes credited to its account with DTC.

Unless indicated otherwise, the provisions of this resolution that follow shall apply to all Notes issued or issuable hereunder, whether initially or in replacement thereof.

Section 3. The Notes shall bear the manual or facsimile signatures of the Chairman of the Board and the Clerk to the Board of the District and the corporate seal or a facsimile of the corporate seal of the District shall be impressed or imprinted, as the case may be, on the Notes.

The certificate of the Local Government Commission of North Carolina to be endorsed on all Notes shall bear the manual or facsimile signature of the Secretary of said Commission and the certificate of authentication of the Note Registrar to be endorsed on all Notes shall be executed as provided hereinafter.

In case any officer of the District or the Local Government Commission of North Carolina whose manual or facsimile signature shall appear on any Notes shall cease to be such officer before the delivery of such Notes, such manual or facsimile signature shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes the same as if he had remained in office until such delivery, and any Note may bear the manual or facsimile signatures of such persons as at the actual time of the execution of such Note shall be the proper officers to sign such Note although at the date of such Note such persons may not have been such officers.

No Note shall be valid or become obligatory for any purpose or be entitled to any benefit or security under this resolution until it shall have been authenticated by the execution by the Note Registrar of the certificate of authentication endorsed thereon.

On January 12, 2012 Vance County Water District solicited proposals from companies to perform the Contracted Operation and Maintenance of the first phase of the Vance County Water District – Phase 1A project. The RFP as attached required that the Respondents provide "III. Required Standard" demonstrating the ability and experience to provide services as contained in the RFP. The RFP also required that the Respondents provide a demonstrable cost that could be evaluated in the District's Operation and Maintenance budget.

The RFP was advertised for participation in a public contract in the local news paper as well as the News & Observer. In addition to the advertisement the RFP was also directly mailed to three contract providers that had previously expressed interest and those being recommended by Hobbs, Upchurch & Associates as firms that we had previous experience with. Those firms were Envirolink, Inc. (ELI), Aqua North Carolina, inc. (a subsidiary of Aqua-America, Inc.) and United Water (a subsidiary of Suez Environmental). On February 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2012 two firms submitted proposals, Envirolink, Inc and Aqua North Carolina, Inc. (ANCI)

Upon evaluation of the two proposals both respondents met the intent and requirements of the RFP. Both Respondents provided cost in a manner consistent with the RFP and in a manner that made it fairly simple to evaluate the proposals on qualifications and price.

ANCI is one of the largest Owner/Operator of public/private utilities in North Carolina having more than 70,000 customers across NC. Most of ANCI's systems are regulated utilities meaning they are privately owned and operated by ANCI and regulated by the NC Utilities Commission with some public/private partnerships in which they perform contract operation with a public body.

ELI is also an experienced provider of Contract Operation and Maintenance for public and private utilities. ELI is a wholly owned North Carolina company based in Bailey, NC. ELI being much smaller than ANCI provides contracted serves to numerous public and private utilities in eastern and central North Carolina. Most of ELI business in on the un-regulated side meaning public sector clients.

Upon review of the proposals it was clear that each respondent has the qualifications and staffing ability to meet the requirements of the RFP. The difference in the two respondents is one; size of the operations two; the types of operations served (Private and Public).

In evaluating the proposals we first confirmed that each of the respondents had met the scope and provided pricing consistent with the RFP and that the pricing was comparable for the purpose of evaluating the O&M Cost and setting the User Rates and Fees to be established by the District.

Attached to this letter is a detailed side by side comparison of each of the respondent's proposal. There will be O&M expenses that the District will incur in addition to those provided by the respondents, in the comparison the District's O&M costs remained the same in the comparison. The cost submitted by the respondents and the projected total O&M costs are as follows:

Envirolink, Inc.: \$71,800

Districts O&M Costs: \$348,127.33 Total O&M Cost: \$420,087.33

Aqua North Carolina: \$116,381.54
Districts O&M Costs: \$348,127.33
Total O&M Cost: \$464,508.87

As mentioned above these costs are detailed in the attachment.

Based upon the review of the proposals from each respondent and the pricing submitted in those proposals, Hobbs, Upchurch & Associates, PA recommends that Vance County Water District make a tentative award of the Operation and Maintenance Contract to Envirolink, Inc., and should be subject to final negotiation of terms to be set forth in an Agreement for Operation and Maintenance Services as outlined submitted proposals.

In regard to the above referenced project on Thursday, March 1, 2012 bids for Vance County Water District Phase 1A Contract 1 and Contract 2 (water mains) were received and opened in the Vance County Meeting Room. Contract 4 Elevated Tank was bid on Tuesday, February 28, 2012, however sufficient number of bids were not received and Contract 4 was re-bid on Friday March 9, 2012.

Contract 1: There were 7 responsive bids opened and read. The bids ranged from a high bid of \$1,710,106.00 to the low bid of \$1,339,814.00 submitted by H.G. Reynolds Company of Henderson, NC. A complete bid tabulation and bid summary are attached. This Contract is located in the northern portion of Phase 1A and included approximately 8.2 miles of 2" through 12" water main and appurtenances.

Contract 2: There were 6 responsive bids opened and read. The bids ranged from a high bid of \$3,812,867.00 to the low bid of \$3,281,392.00 also submitted by H.G. Reynolds Company of Henderson, NC. A complete bid tabulation and bid summary are attached. This Contract is located in the middle section of Phase 1A and included approximately 22 miles of 6" through 12" water main and appurtenances.

Contract 4 200,000 Gallon Elevated Storage Tank (Base Bid): There were 2 responsive bids opened and read during this re-bid. The bids ranged from a high bid of \$526,910 to the low bid of \$482,000 submitted by Caldwell Tanks, Inc of Louisville, KY. Additionally an alternated bid was accepted for the construction of a 150,000 gallon elevated tank at a cost of \$470,860. A complete bid tabulation is attached.

The total project as bid includes approximately 30 miles of 2" through 12" water mains that have the potential to serve approximately 888 users at 100% participation. Based upon the current sign-ups there are approximately 532 users equating 17.75 houses/mile and 60% participation rate. It is reasonable to assume that there will be an incremental increase of approximately 10-15% of the users during the construction period equating to 612 users (69% participation and 20 houses/mile).

The Total Project Costs including Construction Contracts 1,2 and 4, engineering at the USDA Fee Curve Basis, Resident Inspection, Land and Rights of Ways, Legal, Capitalized Interest for interim construction financing, Construction Contingencies, User Tap Fees and other soft costs as shown in the attached total project budget totaling \$5,737,774. Assuming full utilization of the Grant funds from USDA and NCRC and offsetting tap fee revenues the net project cost would be approximately \$3,840,563. A complete final project budget, projected annual operating budget, and proposed rate schedule is attached with this transmittal.

1-60 2-EW Based upon the bids received, review of the project budget the Contractor qualifications Hobbs, Upchurch & Associates, recommends that Vance County Water District make award to H.G. Reynolds Company for Contract 1 in the amount of \$1,339,814.00 and for Contract 2 in the amount of \$3,281,392.00 and to award Contract 4 to Caldwell Tanks, Inc. in the amount of \$482,000 for the 200,000 Gallon Elevated Storage Tank (Base Bid). As mentioned above an alternate bid was accepted, however for the incremental cost difference of \$41,000 to gain an additional capacity of 50,000 gallons it would be the recommendation of HUA to move forward with the 200,000 gallon tank. All awards shall be subject to approval of USDA, NCRC and the Local Government Commission approvals.

#### Water District Phase 1A Capital Project Ordinance

BE IT ORDAINED by the Governing Board of the County of Vance, North Carolina, that, pursuant to Section 13.2 of Chapter 159 of the General Statutes of North Carolina, the following capital project ordinance is hereby adopted:

- Section 1. The project authorized is the construction of the Water District Phase 1A water lines and tank to be financed by the sale of general obligation bonds and reserves.
- Section 2. The officers of this unit are hereby directed to proceed with the capital project within the terms of the bond resolution and the budget contained herein.

- Section 5. The Finance Director is hereby directed to maintain within the Capital Project Fund sufficient detailed accounting records to satisfy the requirements of the grantor agency, the grant agreements, and federal regulations. The terms of the installment resolution also shall be met.
- Section 6. Funds may be advanced from the General Fund for the purpose of making payments as due. Reimbursement requests should be made to the grantor agency in an orderly and timely manner.
- Section 7. The Finance Director is directed to report, on a monthly basis, on the financial status of each project element in Section 3.

Section 8. The Budget Officer is directed to include a detailed analysis of past and future costs and revenues on this capital project in every budget submission made to this Board.

Section 9. Copies of this capital project ordinance shall be furnished to the Clerk to the Governing Board, and to the Budget Officer and the Finance Director for direction in carrying out the project.

# County Manager's Report

# Vance County County Manager's Report to the Board March 12, 2012

- **A.** Proclamation for Spring Litter Sweep. North Carolina counties and cities are encouraged to proclaim April 14 28, 2012 as a designated time to clean roadsides in their jurisdictions. Vance County citizens are urged to volunteer in this important effort to beautify the community. **Recommendation:** Approve the proposed proclamation of April 14 -28, 2012 as Spring Litter Sweep in Vance County.
- **B. Schools' Capital Outlay.** The Vance County Schools have requested the transfer of \$16,072 from various line items within their existing capital outlay budget to make an emergency repair to a chiller at Henderson Middle School. Transfers exceeding 10% of line items require Board of Commissioners approval. This has the support of the Superintendent and will be approved by the Board of Education in its meeting on March 12. Due to much warmer than normal weather, the need for immediate repair becomes more essential. **Recommendation:** Approve the request by the Vance County Schools to transfer \$16,072 from within the existing capital outlay budget to make emergency repairs to the chiller at Henderson Middle School, contingent upon Board of Education action.
- C. Economic Development Grants. Some remaining grant documents for the Semprius project need approval by the Board of County Commissioners. Further, the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners needs to be duly authorized to execute all remaining grant documents related to the project. Recommendation: Approve the necessary grant documents as presented and authorize the Chairman to execute all remaining documents relative to the Semprius economic development project.



**D.** Lease Agreement for Back-up 911 Center. City and County staff and legal counsels are currently developing a lease agreement for space at the Henderson Operations Center for a back-up 911 Center. It is not available at the time of agenda distribution; however, it will be provided as soon as it is completed. **Recommendation:** Approve the lease agreement for space with the City of Henderson for a back-up 911 Center at the Henderson Operations Center, contingent upon approval by the City.

# Committee Reports and Recommendations

# Vance County Committee Reports and Recommendations March 12, 2012

#### A. Human Resources Committee

Position Vacancies. (A) The Jail has a position vacancy for a Detention Officer Lieutenant. This position is essential within the Jail. Shortages of staff can affect the overall operation of the facility as well as compromise the safety of personnel and the security of the facility. (B) The Jail has a position vacancy for a Detention Officer Sergeant. This position is essential within the Jail. Shortages of staff can affect the overall operation of the facility as well as compromise the safety of personnel and the security of the facility. (C) The Jail has two position vacancies for Detention Officers. This position is essential within the Jail. Shortages of staff can affect the overall operation of the facility as well as compromise the safety of personnel and the security of the facility. (D) Fire and EMS has a position vacancy for an EMT Paramedic/Fire Lieutenant. This position is essential to the operation as the department tries to ensure a minimum staffing level of ten EMT/Firefighters per shift. (E) The Sheriff's Office has a position vacancy for a Deputy Specialist. This law enforcement officer performs specialized and responsible assignments such as serving as a detective to investigate crimes or to conduct narcotics investigations, performing special crisis intervention programming and training, or performing specialized civil processes in a program for collection of writs of execution. (G) The Sanitation Department has a position vacancy for a Landfill Scale Operator. This position is responsible for the daily operation of the scales at the County Solid Waste Landfill. Committee Recommendation: [Recommendations are contingent upon endorsement by the Human Resources Committee.] Authorize the staff to fill the vacant positions as requested.

#### B. Education Committee

The Joint Education Committee met on February 21<sup>st</sup> to discuss various issues of mutual interest and concern. A presentation was made by the Chief Court Counselor and a Henderson Police Officer regarding *challenges with student behavior* and possible strategies to work with troubled youth. Funding is necessary for such programs. The Schools were advised to draft a plan if they wanted to proceed with the strategies and to discuss it with the County at budget time. Superintendent Ron Gregory presented the *Schools' Facility Plan*. The Plan includes short (0-10 years) and long (10 - 15 years) range facility needs. The projected needs total \$16,043,102 and do not reflect contingencies, administrative, or design fees (DPI projects that

these fees average around 14%). The plan will serve as a guide for the Schools and County for future budgeting purposes. Superintendent Gregory also presented the *STEM Plan* - a middle school program for students with interest and skills in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics. Vance-Granville Community College, NC State University, and NC Central University have all signed on as partners with VC Schools in this special pilot program. Mr. Gregory went over the Schools' *budget calendar* which includes having their request to the County by mid-May. End of course performance scores for the first semester at NVHS (66.3% proficiency) and SVHS (81.4% proficiency) in the areas of English 1, Algebra 1, and Biology were explained. Levels of 60% and higher are deemed as acceptable. The Committee members confirmed that they wish to continue quarterly meetings.

#### C. <u>Public Safety Committee</u>

This Committee met to discuss Animal Shelter plans with Animal Control staff, representatives from the Ruin Creek Animal Rescue Group, an architect and engineer who were engaged through private funding to develop conceptual building plans, and others. Numerous suggestions and ideas were discussed, including the need for cooperation among everyone involved. Ruin Creek expressed the desire to have a separate office for its volunteers to work out of at the new shelter. It was pointed out that with the numerous individuals in attendance at the meeting, there are still other valuable stakeholders who should have input into the planning process, including the Vance County Animal Advisory Committee and the Humane Society. The meeting was considered to be highly productive, with the group deciding to meet again in three to four weeks when the preliminary plans are ready to be reviewed. In the meantime, more visits to other existing shelters were encouraged so that the Vance County Animal Shelter can be a model shelter when it is designed and constructed.

#### D. <u>Technology Committee</u>

The Technology Committee met and discussed progress on several automation projects. The *Content Management System and new County website* will likely be available by late April. CMS training for key staff authorized by Department Heads will occur in advance of the cut over date. After the lengthy contract review process has concluded, installation of fiber optic for the WAN system will begin, which will allow departments to better share information internally, including financial data. The new telephone system is just weeks away from installation. Plans have been made to include a storage area for back-up capabilities in the 911 back-up center. A presentation from Northwoods, a human services technology consultant, was made as an example of what automation can do to create operational efficiencies. Vance County DSS is working with Northwoods to make a budget request for FY 2012-13 to minimize the data that a DSS client has to provide for various social services programs.

## Pending Business

# Vance County Pending Business March 12, 2012

County Water Project. Phase 1A. On Thursday, March 1st, the Vance County Water District received construction bids for water lines in Phase 1A, and water tanks bids are due on Friday, March 9, 2012. The Water District Board is expected to award bids in its March 12<sup>th</sup> meeting, contingent upon final approval by the Local Government Commission. Formal action by the LGC Board in its April 3rd monthly meeting is expected with sale of bond anticipation notes scheduled for April 17. Funding is expected to be available by May 1st. The County advertised for Operation and Maintenance (O&M) Services and responses were received. A recommendation will be made to the Water Board in the March 12th meeting as well. Phase 1B. The Kittrell Water Association and USDA continue to work together to seek funding for Phase 1B, consistent with action taken by the Commissioners in December 2009. Phases 2A & 2B. Funding from USDA Rural Development has been established for both of these phases. Phase 2A will be funded with \$2.2 million in loans and \$1.62 million in grants. Phase 2B has \$3.94 million in loans and \$1.99 million in grants. USDA Rural Development has been notified that these ARRA funds must be spent on an accelerated schedule - by September 30, 2013. This is a two-year difference in time (previously September 30, 2015). There is the possibility of requesting an extension. Project design is complete and has been submitted to the appropriate regulatory agencies. Highway right-ofway encroachment agreements with NC DOT have been prepared for execution. Due to the timing of the funding of Phases 2A & 2B, it will be important that work on these phases begin as soon as possible. A water purchase agreement with the City is now being negotiated. The proposed O&M services contract will cover Phases 2A and 2B in addition to 1A. Additional sign-ups are essential in 2A and 2B due to the current lack of substantial customer concentration.

**Back-up 911 Center.** The back-up center will be located inside open space of the Henderson Operations Center. The architect, Surapon Sujjavanich, and electrical engineer, Michael Killian, are completing drawings and plans for the Center. Local quotes for construction work will be solicited and a recommendation on a contractor will be made to the Board of Commissioners in its April meeting. According to the architect and local contractors, if actual work can begin by May 1<sup>st</sup>, the construction phase of the project can be completed by June 30<sup>th</sup>. The Center will be metered separately from the remainder of the building for all utilities. Separate pricing on all telecommunications equipment and secondary systems has been obtained and installation will occur once the construction is completed in late June. The City and County staff are developing a lease agreement for about 1510 sq. ft. of space. There will be no rental costs to the County.

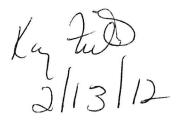

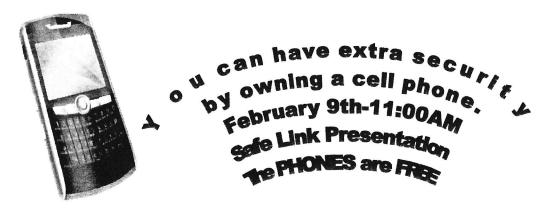

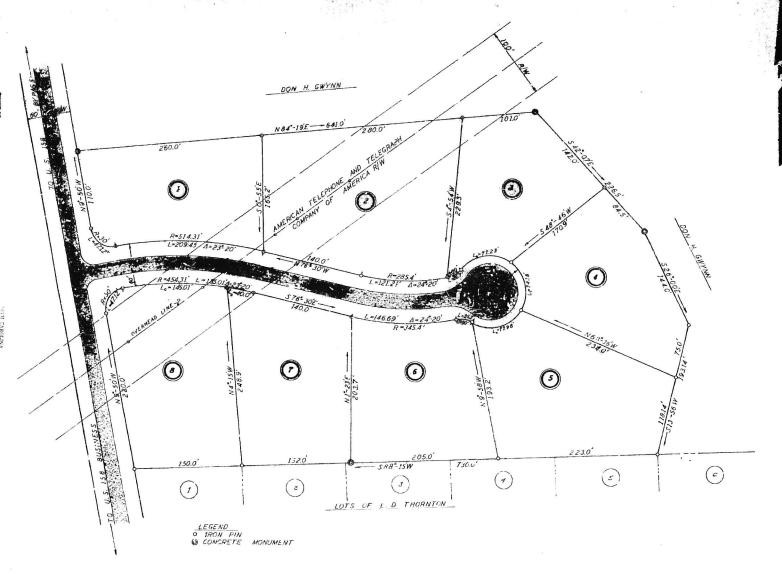
