The Vance County Board of Education met in regular session on Monday, February 13, 2012, 7:00 p.m., Administrative Services Center Board Room. Board members present were: Gloria J. White, Chair, Darlynn P. Oxendine, Vice Chair, Emeron J. Cash, Ruth M. Hartness, Ronald B. Kinsley, and Dorothy M. Williams. Margaret A. Ellis was unable to attend. A. Dr. Larry Webb, Principal of Eaton Johnson Middle School, introduced Dr. Priscilla Chavis-Lockley, counselor at Eaton Johnson, and 23 current and former members of the Ambassadors' Program. Dr. Webb presented the Vance County Schools' Shining Moment in Education Award to International Business Machines (IBM). Angela Chappell, an executive assistant at IBM, accepted the award, a large, crystal vase with an engraved wooden base. Dr. Webb thanked IBM for its support of the Eaton Johnson Ambassadors' Program. INTERSCHOLASTIC ATHLETICS

Interscholastic athletics shall be conducted in accordance with rules and regulations set forth by the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction, the North Carolina High School Athletic Association, the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, and the Vance County Board of Education. Policies, procedures, and guidelines for interscholastic athletics are detailed in the Vance County Schools Athletics Program Handbook.

The Board supports the concept of interscholastic athletics. Such athletic competition should provide activities, facilities, and competent staff members to help each student develop to the limit of capacity, skill ability, and interest that will enable him/her to live and serve best in the community.

"Residence" as used for athletic eligibility purposes is defined by the Vance County Board of Education as the equivalent of the term "domicile" as applied by the courts of North Carolina. A student cannot have more than one residence for eligibility purposes. Each school's Principal and Athletic Director must be able to verify the residence status of each athlete whose name is listed on the school's eligibility list.

Except as otherwise provided, the residence of a student athlete shall be deemed to be that of the parent or the sole surviving parent or the legal guardian.

In the event the parents are separated or divorced, the residence of the student shall be that of the parent to whom a court of competent jurisdiction has awarded custody. If no custody order has been entered, the residence shall be deemed to be that of the parent who had actual custody immediately upon separation.

Students in grades 7-8, Middle School, who participates in interscholastic athletics must meet all of the requirements of the Department of Public Instruction and the Vance County Board of Education.

Students in grades 9-12, High School, who participate in interscholastic athletics must meet all of the requirements of the North Carolina High School Athletic Association and the Vance County Board of Education. **Students must maintain a 2.0 GPA during each semester to participate in athletics.**

Students in grades 7-8, Middle School, and grades 9-12, High School, who participate in school system sponsored and supervised interscholastic athletic activities shall be covered by an Athletic Insurance Policy, which provides limited benefits. The policy provides excess coverage for students with other insurance coverage and pays when other benefits have been exhausted. In cases in which a student has no other coverage with a commercial insurance agency, Medicare or Medicaid, the Vance County Schools Athletic Insurance Policy becomes the primary policy of coverage.

In order to be eligible for practice or participation in interscholastic athletic contest, athletes and cheerleaders must receive a medical examination once every 365 days by a duly licensed physician, nurse practitioner or physician's assistant. It is highly recommended that athletes and cheerleaders participate in the medical examination program held each year at Southern Vance High School.

Parents and students are requested to contact middle and high school administrators for additional information on athletics.

Administrators in each school are responsible for setting the proper atmosphere for interscholastic competition. Coaches should emphasize sportsmanship and are reminded of the importance of teaching the basic skills of each sport to all participants.

3. After The Trip


