#### Minutes of the Vance County Board of Education

#### April 2, 2012

The Vance County Board of Education met in regular session on Monday, April 2, 2012, 7:00 p.m., Administrative Services Center Board Room. Board members present were: Gloria J. White, Chair, Darlynn P. Oxendine, Vice Chair, Emeron J. Cash, Margaret A. Ellis, Ruth M. Hartness, Ronald B. Kinsley, and Dorothy M. Williams. Senior staff members present were: Ronald E. Gregory, Superintendent, Wil McLean, Executive Director of Human Resources, Steven Graham, Finance Officer, Terri Hedrick, Public Information Officer, Claiborne Woods, Director of Facilities, and Jerry Stainback, Attorney for the Board.

- 1. Mrs. White called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and welcomed everyone attending. A moment of silence was observed.
- 2. Upon motion by Mrs. Oxendine, second by Mr. Kinsley, the Board unanimously (7-0) approved the minutes of the March 12, 2012 meeting as presented.

- 6. Superintendent's Report
  - (1) Mr. Gregory stated the State Board of Education has granted the Department of Public Instruction the authority to waive five (5) instructional days during the 2012-2013 School Year. The days would be used for professional development to implement the Common Core/Essential Standards Curricula and to continue training with 1:1 devices and classroom interactive equipment.

Mr. Gregory requested the Board's approval to seek a waiver from DPI to use five (5) instructional days for professional development. The waiver would provide 180 instructional days instead of 185 days.

Upon motion by Mrs. Ellis, second by Mrs. Oxendine, the Board unanimously (7-0) approved the School Calendar Waiver Request of five (5) instructional days for professional development.

#### VANCE COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION RESOLUTION REQUESTING ELIMINATION OF DISCRETIONARY BUDGET REVERSIONS TO STATE

WHEREAS, discretionary budget reversions have been in effect since fiscal year 2008-2009 which camouflages the actual state financial support received by school districts, and

WHEREAS, the Vance County School System has returned a total of \$5,189,679.00 due to discretionary budget reversions between the 2008-2009 fiscal year and the 2011-2012 fiscal year; and

**WHEREAS**, the Vance County School System had to return \$2,028,527.00 to the State of North Carolina in fiscal year 2011-2012; and

**WHEREAS**, the projected discretionary reversion for the Vance County School System is expected to increase to at least \$2,378,802.00 for fiscal year 2012-2013; and

**WHEREAS**, the Vance County School System expects to use all of its \$1,430,946.00 federal EduJobs allotment in its 2011-2012 budget; and

**WHEREAS**, the Vance County School System and Superintendent have made cuts in both personnel and essential programs due to the extensive state budget cuts since 2008-2009;

#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The Vance County Board of Education and Superintendent of Schools respectfully request that the legislature of the State of North Carolina eliminate discretionary reversions for the betterment of public education for all school systems in North Carolina. The elimination of the reversions will allow Vance County Schools to offset the loss of federal EduJobs funds at the end of this fiscal year, and would put an end to discretionary reversions in North Carolina.

To the Members of the Vance County Board of County Commissioners:

Over the past few years, the economic downturn has subjected Vance County Schools to costly budget cuts at the federal, state and local levels. During this time, we have utilized many strategies to mitigate the reductions in funding, including maiximizing the funds received through federal recovery and stimulus, utilizing state funding as strategically as possible, and making significant reductions to our state and local operating budgets. In addition, we have covered the costs of increases in utilities, fuel, retirement payments and health care which have further forced us to shift even more funds away from academic and school-based programs.

The administration of Vance County Schools strives to approach budget development in a conservative and fiscally prudent manner in order to ensure that we are making efficient and effective use of the taxpayer dollars entrusted to us. With the anticipation of deeper cuts in state funding, the loss of federal stimulus dollars, and the slow recovery of the local economy, our school system cannot continue to make drastic budget cuts that diminish the quality of the educational services provided to our students and challenge our abilities to meet or exceed the increasingly rigorous academic standards at state and federal levels. Public education is an important economic and social driver for our community, and after four consecutive years of budget cuts that have financially challenged Vance County Schools, we feel that it's appropriate to ask our local government and community to support our schools with adequate funding that will remove this financial barrier that is hindering the academic progress of our students. Through the supplemental information provided in this document, the Vance County Board of Education seeks to make aware and inform county leaders and the general public of the budgetary needs of Vance County Schools.

#### **State Budget Outlook**

It's important to note that since the 2008-2009 fiscal year, state funding for Vance County Schools has been cut by more than \$12.3 million, which has resulted in the loss of numerous positions, many school-based. Like most North Carolina school districts, the budget storm has left Vance County Schools without resources and options as budget cuts are expected to deepen even further for the 2012-2013 fiscal year. The loss of two revenue sources combine for an additional \$328 million reduction in funds for school districts even before lawmakers return to Raleigh.

With respect to the 2012-2013 fiscal year budget, North Carolina will lose federal stimulus funds that have served as a crutch to school districts during the economic downturn. The Education Jobs Fund, which provided Vance County Schools with \$1,452,192 in the 2011-2012 fiscal year, has expired and will not be available to help retain teachers, teacher assistants, custodians, clerical staff and other school-based personnel for the 2012-2013 fiscal year.

The LEA Adjustment, commonly referred to as the "discretionary cut" was re-implemented as a recurring state budget item in the 2009-2010 fiscal year over the objections of school districts. The cut began at \$225 million and increased to \$304.7 million in the 2010-2011 fiscal year.

In the 2011-2012 fiscal year budget, it was again increased by an additional \$124.2 million, bringing the total discretionary cut to \$428.9 million. For the 2012-2013 fiscal year, the State Budget has set in motion a \$74 million increase in the LEA Discretionary Reduction that school districts must absorb by identifying which cuts to make to cover their ADM-based share of the astonishing \$503.1 million total that must be reverted back to the state. Since the 2008-2009 fiscal year, Vance County Schools has reverted back \$5,189,679 of its initial state allotment received. For the 2012-2013 fiscal year, the reversion amount for Vance County Schools will increase to \$2,307,761, as compared to \$2,028,527 in 2011-2012, resulting in an additional loss of state funding of \$279,234.

We ask that you draw particular attention to the spreadsheet found in Section C, Page 3 of this document as it will provide you with an understanding of the potential impact to Vance County Schools in terms of dollars and positions in comparing the 2012-2013 state planning allotment to the 2011-2012 state initial allotment received.

#### Local Current Expense Budget Request: \$8,999,572

The Local Current Expense Fund is the primary operating fund of the Vance County Board of Education that is used to account for most of its financial resources. The purpose of this fund is to supplement the State Public School Fund revenues in covering the current operating expenses of the school district to meet the requirements of state and local educational policies. With four consecutive years of budget cuts at the state level, the Local Current Expense Fund has been shouldering more and more of the burden. During this time, local operating expenses have risen while local operating reveues have declined.

With respect to local operating revenues, by the end of the 2011-2012 fiscal year, the receipt of fines and forfeitures will have decreased by approximately \$253,773 or 52.46% from the 2008-2009 fiscal year. As an additional loss in revenues, the County elected to decrease its local current expense appropriation to Vance County Schools by \$147,560. Since the economic downturn, Vance County Schools has cut local operating expenses to the bare bones in order to minimize losses in positions and to preserve the integrity of instructional and support programs as much as possible. The continual rise in some operating expense line items are beyond our control. State-mandated increases to the employer's retirement contribution percentage have increased by 4.98% since the 2008-2009 fiscal year. The state-mandated employer's share of health insurance premium has increased by \$774 per employee since the 2008-2009 fiscal year. For the 2012-2013 fiscal year, the employer's retirement contribution percentage will be increased by an additional \$261 per employee. No state-mandated salary increases are expected to be adopted into the 2012-2013 State Budget.

It should be noted that charter school growth is having a direct impact on the district's average daily membership (ADM) and the loss of state and local funding. For the 2008-2009 fiscal year, Vance County Schools had 454 in-county students attending charter schools. For the 2011-2012 fiscal year, we currently have 649 in-county students attending charter schools, an increase of 195 students or 42.95% over this time period.

Vance County Schools will be paying out to charter schools approximately \$622,644 or 8.64% of its county appropriation of \$7,202,440 received for local current expenses for the 2011-2012 fiscal year. Charter school growth projections indicate that the 2012-2013 fiscal year will see a percentage increase of 12.48% in students attending charter schools.

Due to the increase in the LEA Adjustment (Discretionary Reversion) of \$279,234, the loss of \$1,452,192 in federal stimulus funds, and the increase in operating costs that we cannot control, Vance County Schools is seeking an appropriation from the county for local current expenses for the 2012-2013 fiscal year in the amount of \$8,999,572 in order to sustain our current level of provided educational and operational services.

#### <u>Teacher Supplements</u> Budget Request: \$1,319,731

For the 2012-2013 fiscal year, Vance County Schools is requesting an increase in our county appropriation for teacher supplements of \$289,731 or 28.13%. The increase in additional funding would support the full payout of local supplements to our teachers and would free up other operating revenues that are currently being budgeted to cover the deficiency.

#### Capital Outlay Budget Request: \$3,154,555

The County Board of Commissioners appropriates funding for recurring capital outlay needs to Vance County Schools on an annual basis. This appropriation provides needed funding for recurring capital outlay requirements such as school furniture and equipment, minor repair projects to improve school facilities, purchase of replacement service vehicles and activity buses, and the completion of projects which will assure the health and safety of students and employees, as well as enhance the learning environment. The amount of funding provided by the county for these recurring capital outlay needs has remained level at \$425,000 since the 2006-2007 fiscal year. Since this time, the state has diverted dedicated corporate income tax revenues from its Public School Building Capital Fund to its General Fund in order to cover for the state budget shortfall. In the past, Vance County Schools has been able to rely on these dedicated revenues to fund relatively small to mid-sized facility needs projects. This diversion of revenues has created an annual loss of approximately \$325,000 in capital outlay funding for our school district. The lack of sufficient funding on the state and local level has resulted in: (1) a deferment in previously identified priority need capital outlay projects, (2) a more rapid deterioration of school district buildings and infrastructure, and (3) a backlog in fulfilling the short and long range projects identified in our Capital Improvements Plan.

With that being said, for the 2012-2013 fiscal year, Vance County Schools is presenting to the county a capital outlay budget request that draws attention to a total of \$3,154,555 of identified capital outlay needs that seek to service our current debt, support our needed categorical improvements, and align with our Capital Improvements Plan. In developing the enclosed capital outlay budget request, Vance County Schools has prioritized needs based on student and staff safety, cost reduction measures, code compliance, functionality and serviceability. The school district encourages the county to issue a previously approved Qualified Zone Academy Bond (QZAB) in the amount of \$2,000,000 prior to the bond issuance deadline date of December 31, 2012.

By issuing this bond, major school building structural repairs that are included in the total capital outlay budget request in the amount of \$1.1 million can be addressed.

Several statutes assign to counties the responsibility for funding specific capital outlay expenditures. Also, N.C.G.S. 115C-426.2 strongly encourages boards of county commissioners and local boards of education to conduct periodic joint meetings each fiscal year to assess the school capital outlay needs and to develop and update a joint five-year plan for meeting those needs, and to consider the plan in the preparation and approval of each year's budget. With the identification of needed major capital improvement projects due to the age and condition of the school district's facilities and infrastructure, the deficiency in adequate revenue sources from the state and local level will result in the school district having to request assistance from the county for any major facility damage or major equipment breakdown. As such, it remains imperative that the two boards work collaboratively to take the necessary proactive steps and proper precautions to preserve school property and to prevent critical situations that would require the immediate need of financial resources.

#### In Summary

Four consecutive years of budget cuts have adversely affected the classrooms of Vance County Schools, where individual students ultimately have suffered the consequences. We recognize the fact that North Carolina's economy is struggling to recover from a recession from which no level of government has been immune; however, the divesting of funds from the state and local level from the programs and services that promote the well-being of children and youth is not a budget solution- it's a budget problem. Prioritizing the well-being of children and youth is smart fiscal policy. Without well-educated graduates ready to meet the demands of a competitive global economy, you have a state and local government unable to attract and retain the businesses and jobs needed for economic vitality and prosperity.

Statistics show that the investment in the public education system on the state and local levels are below national and state averages. In addition, statistics show that North Carolina and in particular, Vance County, rank among the highest in children that live in poverty. Recent declines in state support for public schools have dropped North Carolina's per pupil funding to 49th in the nation. In fact, North Carolina would have to increase investments in education by 29% just to reach the national average in educational expenditures per pupil. The current appropriation from Vance County represents a per pupil expenditure of \$1,220, which is below the state average per pupil expenditure of \$1,709. North Carolina has the 10th worst child poverty rate in the country- ninth among our most vulnerable children, those under the age of six. In Vance County, 35.5% of children live in poverty, as compared to the state average of 24.6%.

What do these statistics tell us about the value placed on providing educational programs and supports to the children who need it the most? We cannot continue to ask our students and staff to do more with less. As the statistics show, the price of doing so is one that as a school system, as a community, as a parent, and most importantly, as a child is just too costly to bear. Adequate local funding is crucial to Vance County Schools in its commitment to educate all students and to prepare them for lifelong learning and productive citizenship.

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Together as one, the Vance County Board of Education and the Vance County Board of Commissioners can do what's right to preserve the quality of life of the children and youth of Vance County in the short run, and improve the economic competitiveness of Vance County and North Carolina in the long run.



The "allotted ADM" is defined as the higher of either: (1) the actual higher of the first two months ADM of the previous school year, or (2) DPI's projected ADM for the current school year. For 2012-2013, the higher of the two is the actual ADM of the of the previous school year of 6,848. This represents a decrease of 155 students (2.21%) from the 2011-2012 allotted ADM of 7,003, which was also the actual ADM of the previous school year. State planning allotments are likely to change. These figures represent state projections based strictly on formula adjustments and changes in allotted Average Daily Membership (ADM) figures. These figures represent state projections until a budget is passed by the General Assembly. State legislative budget increases or reductions, mandatory discretionary reductions, and charter school enrollment are not included in these planning estimates and would represent additional adjustments to these figures. This worksheet presents only those allotments for which we have received planning estimates from the State. - (8) Decrease is due to a reduction in DPI's Allotted ADM for grades 8-12.
- (9) The state allotment for school technology is no longer being funded.
- (10) Addresses the capacity needs of local school administrative units to meet the needs of disadvantaged students.

- (1) The Vance County Board of Commissioners adopted a 2011-2012 Budget Ordinance that included level funding in the county appropriation for local teacher supplements for Vance County Schools.
- (2) Local school boards receive a refund for local sales taxes paid. The local rate portion of sales tax is currently at 2.00%.
- (3) This amount represents the recovery of general management costs related to federal grants and contracts for direction and control of system-wide activities not confined to one school, subject or operation. Decrease is due to a reduction in the restricted indirect cost computation from 2.441% to 1.827%, and the reduction in federal funds received.
- (4) Budgeted amount is based on YTD actual revenues received and projected out, adjusted for the anticipated rate of return on invested funds. Decrease is due to the bank passing on the expense to collateralize funds of the school system over the allowable amount insured by the FDIC.
- (5) Budgeted amount is based on prior year actual revenues received.
- (6) The minimum pay for an AFJROTC instructor is the difference between retired pay and the active duty pay and allowances that the instructor would receive if ordered to active duty. The Air Force reimburses the school one half of the minimum pay.

- (10) The Teen Prevention Education Program (PEP) is a school-based program supported by the NCDHHS Teen Pregnancy Prevention Initiative and provides funding to NVHS for peer-to-peer education to increase students' knowledge, skills, and behaviors associated with healthy decision-making.
- (11) Removed from budget as a non-recurring revenue source.
- (12) The School Nurse Funding Initiative (SNFI) is a school-based program funded by the NCDHHS and provides funding to local education agencies for employment of two (2) nurses.
- (13) Removed from budget as a non-recurring revenue source. Laptop fees collected from students through the 1:1 Initiative will be maintained in the Local Technology Fund and offset against program expenditures.

#### Building and Grounds Committee Minutes Thursday, April 26, 2012

The Building and Grounds Committee met on Thursday, April 26, 2012, in the Superintendent's Conference Room. Members present were Ruth Hartness, Ronald Kinsley, Ronald E. Gregory, Steve Graham and Claiborne Woods.

Mrs. Hartness called the meeting to order at 8:30 am and followed the agenda.

Mr. Woods introduced Mr. Rob Lease, representative from Argand Energy Solution. Through a power point presentation, Mr. Lease explained the possibility of doing a solar project on the roof of the Administrative Services Center. In addition to the ASC, there are other locations that are also possible candidates for solar energy. This project is at no cost to the school system and will provide the school system with a positive cash flow for many years. Information has been presented to Jerry Stainback, School Board Attorney, for review.

Upon a request by Board Chair Gloria J. White regarding replacing the bleachers at Southern Vance High School, Mr. Woods provided the replacement cost as well as a less expensive alternative. The estimated cost for replacing the bleachers is \$123,000.00. A less expensive alternative is \$10,996.00 which is installing walkway aisles on each bank or section. The committee agreed the less expensive price would be considered during the budget process.

Mr. Woods reported that Emergency Management had obtained automatic electrical transfer switches for Eaton Johnson, Northern Vance and Southern Vance. In the event these schools need to serve as shelters for our residents, electrical power could be provided with stand-by generators. Emergency Management has funding for the installation of the switches. Mr. Woods is working with them to obtain pricing.

The regular monthly maintenance updates were included as part of the package. (Attachment 1)

As requested by Mrs. Hartness, Mr. Gregory gave an update on the Eaton Johnson STEM Project. An overview of how the program would operate and how the students would be served for their non-core courses was also shared.

The next scheduled meeting is May 24, 2012 at 8:30 am in the Superintendent's Conference Room.
