The 23 April 2012 Short Regular Meeting of the Henderson City Council was called to order by Mayor James D. O'Geary at 6:05 p.m. in the R. G. "Chick" Young, Jr. Council Chambers, Municipal Building, 134 Rose Avenue, Henderson, NC.

Mayor O'Geary opened the meeting by saying how good it was to see a full Chamber. He stated Council is always willing to listen to any concerns citizens may have and thanked everyone for coming.

ROLL CALL

The City Clerk called the roll and advised Mayor O'Geary a quorum was present.

INVOCATION AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Council Member Peace-Jenkins led those in attendance in a prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance.

ADJUSTMENTS TO/APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Mayor O'Geary asked if there were any adjustments to the Agenda. City Clerk McCrackin advised there would be a Closed Session in Accordance with G.S. §143-318.11(1)(3) regarding an Attorney-Client Matter and G.S. §143-318.11(1)(6) regarding a Personnel Matter. Council Member Inscoe moved to accept the adjusted Agenda. Motion seconded by Council Member Davis and unanimously approved.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mayor O'Geary asked for any corrections to and/or approval of the minutes. Council Member Peace-Jenkins moved the approval of the following minutes as presented: 9 April 2012 Regular Meeting. Motion seconded by Council Member Rainey and unanimously approved.

RECOGNITIONS/PRESENTATIONS

Mayor O'Geary recognized the Leadership Vance Class of 2012. Executive Director Barnes said the class was glad to be in attendance and shared that the director of the class, Rachel Hedrick, was unable to attend as she had been hospitalized. Mayor O'Geary then asked the class to introduce themselves to Council and finally, welcomed them to the meeting.

Mayor O'Geary then presented a proclamation for the Week of the Young Child to Ms. Carolyn Paylor, Director of the Franklin-Granville-Vance Smart Start program. Ms. Paylor thanked the Mayor and Council for their willingness to recognize the importance of children.

Mayor O'Geary then asked Mike Ciriello from the Kerr-Tar Council of Government (COG) to update Council regarding the NCDOT Comprehensive Transportation Plan. Mr. Ciriello stated Loren Nichols, representing the NCDOT Planning Department was present and had a quick update. Ms. Nichols said no adoption or decision was required at this time. The DOT simply requested permission to hold two public forum drop-in sessions for citizen input regarding finishing the outer loop, I-85 interchange improvements and the Dabney Drive proposal. Ms. Nichols stated they have planned the forums for May 15 and 16 at the Kittrell Fire Station and the COG office respectively between 4 and 7 p.m. There were no questions or objections from Council.

PUBLIC HEARING

CDBG Infrastructure Hook-Up Grant. (Reference: CM 12-06)

City Manager Griffin stated the COG has asked that action on this grant be continued until the 14 May 2012 meeting to allow more time to receive applications. To date, only two applications have been received.

No one came forward so Mayor O'Geary then asked if anyone was present who wished to speak in opposition to the grant. No one came forward.

Mayor O'Geary then closed the Public Hearing and stated the CDBG Infrastructure Hook-Up Grant would be continued to 14 May 2012.

Amending Sections of Zoning Codes for the City of Henderson to Provide for Bed & Breakfast Homes, and Amending Sections of Zoning Code for the City of Henderson to Provide for Bed & Breakfast Inns. (*CAF 12-A-33*)

City Manager Griffin asked Planning Director Erris Dunston and City Attorney John Zollicoffer to brief Council on these amendments. Ms. Dunston stated the Planning Board revisited the Bed and Breakfast changes as discussed during the previous Council meeting and worked diligently to address concerns while protecting the character of bed and breakfasts. She said the Board found State regulations that were reviewed and are included in these changes. She said an *inn* differs from a *home* in that an *inn* is a larger business facility located in a business zoning district where a *home* is located in a private, single family detached residence for a smaller number of guests and are located in residential zoning districts. Attorney Zollicoffer said these ordinances are compatible with State regulations.

Council Member Coffey asked about the number of people vs. number of rooms for the *inns*. Attorney Zollicoffer said that was in compliance with State regulations.

Council Member Daeke asked about the 10% ownership for *homes* and also wondered about the number of bathrooms per bedroom. Attorney Zollicoffer said the percentage was set in case of ownership split (i.e., an heir situation). Mr. Daeke felt the percentage should be 25 or 50%. Regarding bathrooms, Attorney Zollicoffer said it was acceptable to share a bathroom and it would keep the historical value of the home.

Council Member Kearney asked if the ordinances dealt with all points discussed previously. Ms. Dunston stated each item on the list, such as signage, lighting, restaurants were reviewed with some being changed and some kept the same.

Council Member Daeke asked for feedback from Council Members regarding the 10% ownership issue and stated part of his concern was maintaining the integrity of the neighborhood. Mayor O'Geary polled the Members with Council Members Kearney, Coffey, Inscoe, Rainey, Peace-Jenkins, Davis and Daye all agreeing that 10% was sufficient.

With no further discussion, Mayor O'Geary opened the Public Hearing by asking if anyone was present who wished to speak in favor of Bed and Breakfasts. No one came forward so Mayor O'Geary then asked if anyone was present who wished to speak in opposition to Bed and Breakfasts. No one came forward.

Amending City Code Section 16-16, Eliminating Downtown Sidewalk Sales and Displays. (*CAF 12-A-15*)

City Manager Griffin asked Planning Director Erris Dunston to brief Council. Ms. Dunston said extensive work has been done regarding this Ordinance and that the Planning Board voted to remove the encroachment by removing the three paragraphs added in 2007, essentially eliminating downtown sidewalk displays and sales. In so doing, sidewalk sales would now be considered an "event."

Council Member Rainey asked when this Ordinance would go into effect. City Attorney Zollicoffer stated with the date of passage, however, if a permit exists, it would be good until the expiration date (June 2012) and new permits would not be granted.

Mayor O'Geary then opened the Public Hearing by asking if anyone was present who wished to speak in favor of this change. No one came forward, so Mayor O'Geary then asked if anyone was present who wished to speak in opposition to the change.

With no further discussion, Mayor O'Geary closed the Public Hearing and asked for Council's pleasure.

Council Member Peace-Jenkins moved the approval of Ordinance 12-36, *Eliminating Downtown Sidewalk Sales and Displays*. Award of Audit Contract between the City of Henderson and William L. Stark and Company. (*Reference: CAF 12-56; Resolution 12-35*)

City Manager Griffin reminded Council that the services of Phillips, Dorsey, Thomas, Waters & Brafford, P.A. can no longer be used due to the hiring of Finance Director Brafford. Ms. Brafford assured the City Manager that no bifurcation will be needed to complete the audit. Mr. Griffin stated proposals were requested for audit services for FY12, FY13 and FY14. Two proposals were received; 1) Winston, Williams, Creech, Evans Company, LLP from Oxford and 2) William L. Stark and Company from Henderson. It is recommended that the firm of William L. Stark and Company be awarded the \$34,750 contract.

Council Member Coffey inquired about the three-year proposal. Mr. Griffin responded consistency is important, thus the request for three years. He said the amount may vary each year from the original proposal but Council approval will be requested for each year.

- *WHEREAS*, the City of Henderson (City) is highly supportive of the Southeast High Speed Rail Project (HSRP) and believes its implementation will help revive the local economy as did the construction of I-85 did in the 1960's and 1970's, *and*
- *WHEREAS*, Henderson is the largest regional population and commercial retail center in North Central North Carolina along the proposed HSRP route, and is one of two rural stops planned on the HSRP between Petersburg, Virginia and Raleigh, North Carolina, with the other rural stop being Lacrosse, Virginia; and
- *WHEREAS*, the location of a passenger rail station in downtown Henderson would be a significant boost to the redevelopment of the local economic base that has been devastated by the loss of the traditional economic stalwarts of textiles and tobacco in the early part of the decade as well as the lingering negative effects of the current Recession; *and*
- *WHEREAS*, the proposed high speed rail line will run along the same right-of-way that currently provides for the current north/south rail line as it traverses Henderson, and said rail line DIVIDES AND BISECTS the city, thus providing for unique challenges and opportunities to address cross-city transportation connectors in a way that meets the current and future needs of the City and its residents, businesses and visitors; *and*
- *WHEREAS*, the Council has MAJOR CONCERNS ABOUT AND OBJECTIONS to the proposed reconfiguration of local streets and State roads designed to support the planned bridge crossings of the HSRP at Main St. and North Garnett St., Andrews Ave. at N. Garnett St., Chavasse Ave., Dabney Dr. Extension—Alexander St. Extension at US1

Raleigh Rd., J. P. Taylor Rd. at US 1 Raleigh Rd., and the lack of a connection between Nicholas St. and J. P. Taylor Rd.; *and*

- WHEREAS, Mr. Robert Southerland, a private citizen and resident of Gholson Avenue located on the East side of the railroad right-of-way in the vicinity of Chavasse Avenue, addressed the City Council at its 26 July 2010 regular meeting and expressed strong support for keeping the Chavasse Avenue railroad crossing open via construction of an underpass similar to the one currently in use at Charles Street in downtown, and no other citizens came forward to speak for or against the Chavasse Avenue crossing proposal being considered by the City Council; *and*
- *WHEREAS*, the Council has SERIOUS CONCERNS about the impacts of fencing and blocking off the railroad right-of-way and exceeding the current use of said right-of-way in any manner that would have serious, negative impacts on Williams Street and the business properties abutting the railroad right-of-way, particularly within the Downtown area.
- *NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HENDERSON CITY COUNCIL* that it does hereby:
 - 1. *FULLY SUPPORT* the development and fast-track implementation of the Southeast High Speed Rail Project; *and*
 - 2. *FULLY SUPPORT* the location of a rail passenger station in downtown Henderson with daily service on the high speed rail passenger trains; *and*
 - 3. *FULLY SUPPORT* the provision of a pedestrian crossing in the vicinity of Peachtree St., *and*
 - 4. **DOES REQUEST AND FULLY SUPPORT** the inclusion of bike lanes and sidewalks on both sides of any and all local and State streets built and/or reconfigured as part of this project; *and*
 - 5. AFFIRMS that Henderson is a city with a population of approximately 16,000 and the railroad right-of-way **DIVIDES AND BISECTS** the city in half. Cross-city connectors that are functional and effective for traffic flow and delivery of public safety services is critical for the public health, safety and welfare and is also critically vital to the City's future economic growth and development. This is particularly true given the fact that 12 of the existing 17 crossings within the City and its Extraterritorial Jurisdiction are slated to be closed. (See Attachment No. 5). Thus, leaving the City with only 5 existing The addition of the Alexander Ave/Dabney Dr./Raleigh Rd. intersection crossings. would bring the crossing number to 6. The addition of the requested Chavasse Ave. underpass would bring the total crossings to 7. The proposed reconfigurations of the local and State streets and roads to accommodate the HSRP crossings are not well designed and do not think about current and/or future needs of the City's transportation network in a logical and systematic manner; consequently, the City Council does NOT SUPPORT the proposed reconfigurations of local streets and roads to align with the proposed bridges (rail crossings) at as follows:

- a. <u>Main Street Crossing</u>: The City Council appreciates the plan aligning with the Thoroughfare Plan; however, the proposed termination of direct north/south traffic flow along the N. Chestnut St.—Rt. 1, N. Garnett St. corridor is neither satisfactory nor acceptable. This corridor carries a significant amount of traffic that bypasses the core downtown area as well as provides a direct access for police, fire and other public safety delivery services that provide service to the Northern sector of the city. The City Council **STRONGLY OBJECTS** to the proposed design and respectfully requests that the proposed realignment of local and State streets be redesigned to maintain and provide for the north-south N. Chestnut St.—Rt. 1, N. Garnett St. Corridor traffic flow. (See Attachment No. 1 for current HSRP design); *and*
- b. <u>Andrews Avenue Crossing</u>: This avenue is a main connector between I-85 and US Rt. 1 Bypass and has four lanes from I-85 to N. Chestnut Street and three and four lanes from Booth Avenue to Rt. 1 Bypass. The City Council **STRONGLY OBJECTS** to the construction of a two lane bridge crossing and it respectfully requests that the bridge be widened to provide for future traffic needs and to meet the needs of the bridge crossing as articulated in the City's Thoroughfare Plan—or 4 lanes. Further, the reconfiguration of local streets with this construction does not provide for convenient access from N. Garnett Street in downtown onto Andrews Avenue. The City Council respectfully requests that on/off ramps be provided from the new Andrews Avenue Bridge Crossing to N. Garnett Street. Further, it is requested that Williams Street not be closed at Andrews Avenue on the East side of the rail road right-of-way. (See Attachment No. 2 for current HSRP design); *and*
- The current plan is to permanently close the c. Chavasse Avenue Crossing: Chavasse Avenue crossing. The City Council STRONGLY OBJECTS to the permanent closure of the Chavasse Avenue Crossing. While a bridge would not be appropriate due to the historic eligible nature of the residential neighborhood on the East side of the railroad right-of-way, the City Council respectfully requests and proposes that an underpass be provided for Chavasse Avenue in a manner similar to the underpass provided at Charles Street in downtown. This crossing is seen as being critically necessary for the effective delivery of fire services from the Dabney Drive Fire Station into East Henderson as well as the effective access for police personnel. This crossing is extremely important given the fact that the current plans would otherwise leave approximately a 1 mile gap between crossings in a heavily traveled part of the city and where four other downtown crossings are planned to be eliminated. Thus, the only crossings for this heavily populated area of the city without the Chavasse Ave. crossing would be Charles St. Underpass at the northern edge of the Business District and Dabney Dr./Alexander Ave. crossing which is almost at the end of the city limits. (See Attachment No. 3 for current HSRP design); and
- d. <u>Dabney Drive Extension—Alexander Avenue Extension</u>: The proposed relocation of Dabney Drive to connect with the Alexander Avenue Extension is almost out of the city limits; therefore, It is critical that the connection provide for

the direct access onto Nicholas Street in order to provide for direct emergency services access from the Dabney Drive Fire Station and police cruisers onto Williams Street and the East Henderson area. The City Council **STRONGLY OBJECTS** to any design that does not provide for at-grade or on/off ramp connections from the proposed overpass improvements of Alexander Avenue onto Nicholas Street. The City Council respectfully requests that direct access from the rail crossing improvement onto Nicholas Street be designed and constructed as part of this project. (See Attachment No. 4 for current HSRP design); *and*

- e. J. P. Taylor Road Crossing: The proposed rail crossing at this intersection does not provide for direct access onto US 1 Business/Raleigh Road. This is a critical crossing providing general traffic and public safety service delivery to Southeast Henderson. The City Council **STRONLY OBJECTS** to the proposed design because it does not provide for direct access from the J. P. Taylor rail crossing improvement onto US 1 Raleigh Road. It is critical that on/off ramps be provided to connect Raleigh Road with J. P. Taylor Road in order to maintain a high level of public safety service delivery services, particularly fire and police services into the area East of the rail road tracks. The City Council respectfully requests that on/off ramps be provided so as to connect US1 Raleigh Road with the J. P. Taylor rail crossing improvements. Additionally, Belmont Dr. should be widened and improved from the intersection of J. P. Taylor Rd. Extension to Raleigh Road in order to adequately handle the increased traffic load being placed on this small, rural road. (See Attachment No. 6 for current HSRP design); *and*
- f. <u>Nicholas St. Not Connecting with J. P. Taylor Road</u>: The proposed road configuration does not provide for a physical connection between Nicholas St. and the J. P. Taylor Rd. This is unacceptable as it completely eliminates any direct public safety access to the neighborhoods and businesses to the East of the Railroad track. The City Council **STRONGLY OBJECTS** to the termination of Nicholas St. prior to its intersection with J. P. Taylor Road and it requests that it be extended from its planned termination point to J. P. Taylor Rd. in order to ensure that the area can and will receive adequate and appropriate public safety services. (See Attachment No. 7 for current HSRP design).
- 6. **EXPRESSES Strong concern for and objection** to the fencing off of the railroad rightof-way and exceeding the current use of said right-of-way for the Southeast High Speed Rail project in a manner that would cause serious, negative impacts on the North/South corridor along Williams Street and the businesses that abut said right-of-way, especially within the downtown area.



Executive Summary:

The Vance County Tourism Development Authority sponsors the annual "Show, Shine, Shag & Dine" event in the Downtown Henderson area. This is a very successful event drawing large numbers of participants and spectators internationally, increasing the City of Henderson's recognition and tourism appeal.

It has been brought to the City of Henderson's attention that there are some vendors who set up during the event without permission from the organizers of this event. This is causing some concern and issues with those who have followed the proper procedures to be allowed to sell their wares at this event. Because of this, the Vance County Tourism Development Authority is requesting that the City of Henderson give them the authority to issue permits, making it unlawful to conduct sales within a block radius of any special Tourism Sponsored event, located in downtown Henderson and approved by the Henderson City Council, without a permit, which must be displayed in full view.

AN ORDINANCE TO DELEGATE TO THE VANCE COUNTY TOURISM DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY THE RIGHT TO ISSUE PEDDLER'S OR VENDER'S PERMITS DURING SPECIAL TOURISM SPONSORED EVENTS

The City Council of the City of Henderson, North Carolina doth ordain:

<u>Section 1.</u> That Section 10-37 of the City Code is amended by adding an additional paragraph to the end of the same reading as follows:

"Notwithstanding the above, the provisions of Sections 10-34 through 10-37 of the City Code, the City of Henderson authorizes the Vance County Tourism Development Authority the sole permission to issue peddler's or vendor's permits during any Tourism sponsored event located in downtown Henderson and approved by the Henderson City Council relative to all peddlers or vendors operating on the streets within a one block radius of the event boundaries, but not to be applicable south of Young Avenue, north of Andrews Avenue, east of William Street, or west of Chestnut Street. All persons conducting sales within the event area (or within a one block radius thereof within the above limited boundaries) must display the permit issued by the sponsor of the event in a conspicuous place at the respective sales location."

<u>Section 2.</u> The foregoing Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage.

Executive Summary

The City must consider its one-person one-vote status vis-a-vis the 2010 Decennial Census results. Raw block data was received in early March 2011; however, the data needs to be "snapped" onto the City's GIS system. Once the data is snapped and blocks are confirmed, particularly where the city limit lines bisect, census blocks analysis can begin.

Time to analyze the data and make a determination of compliance among the Wards is required. Since there is a loss of population between 2000 and 2010, it is felt some ward boundary adjustments will be necessary.

After determination is made to adjust boundaries, time will be required to review various adjustment options, obtain public input and final decision making. Additionally, any changes approved by the City Council must also be approved by the State Board of Elections and the Civil Rights Section of the United States Department of Justice (USDOJ). The USDOJ review is subject to a 90 day review period.

The City Council delayed its 1990 elections in order to effect redistricting. The 2000 election was not delayed because a local "census" had been taken as part of several annexations. The data provided by this local census was sufficient to determine the City was in compliance with the one-person one-vote rule.

Given the time required to analyze data and make any necessary changes, the City Attorney has recommended City Council schedule a public hearing to consider delaying the 2011 municipal elections. If approved, it is expected the elections would be held in May 2012 and newly elected officials would be seated 1 July 2012.

- *NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED* by the City Council of the City of Henderson that a public hearing be held at 7:00 o'clock PM on the 11th day of April, 2011 in the City Council Chambers in City Hall on Rose Avenue in Henderson, North Carolina on the question of delaying the 2011 municipal elections pursuant to N.C.G.S. §160A-23.1.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S.160A-23.1 reads as rewritten:

"§ 160A-23.1. Special rules for redistricting after 2000-2010 census.

As soon as possible after receipt of federal census information in 20012011 the 8 (a) council of any city which elects the members of its governing board on a district basis, or 9 where candidates for such office must reside in a district in order to run, shall evaluate the 10 existing district boundaries to determine whether it would be lawful to hold the next election 11 without revising districts to correct population imbalances. If such revision is necessary, the 12 council shall consider whether it will be possible to adopt the changes (and obtain approval 13 from the United States Department of Justice, if necessary) before the third day before opening 14 of the filing period for the municipal election. The council shall take into consideration the time 15 that will be required to afford ample opportunities for public input. If the council determines 16 that it most likely will not be possible to adopt the changes (and obtain federal approval, if 17 necessary) before the third business day before opening of the filing period, and determines 18 further that the population imbalances are so significant that it would not be lawful to hold the 19 next election using the current electoral districts, it may adopt a resolution delaying the election 20 21 so that it will be held on the timetable provided by subsection (d) of this section. Before adopting such a resolution, the council shall hold a public hearing on it. The notice of public 22 hearing shall summarize the proposed resolution and shall be published at least once in a 23 newspaper of general circulation, not less than seven days before the date fixed for the hearing. 24 Notwithstanding adoption of such a resolution, if the council proceeds to adopt the changes, 25 26 (and federal approval is obtained, if necessary) by the end of the third business day before the 27 opening of the filing period, the election shall be held on the regular schedule under the revised electoral districts. Any resolution adopted under this subsection, and any changes in electoral 28 district boundaries made under this section shall be submitted to the United States Department 29 30 of Justice (if the city is covered under Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965), the State 31 Board of Elections, and to the board conducting the elections for that city.

(b) In adopting any revisal under this section, if the council determines that in order for the plan to conform to the Voting Rights Act of 1965, the number of district seats needs to be increased or decreased, it may do so by following the procedures set forth in Part 4 of Article 5 of Chapter 160A of the General Statutes, except that the ordinance under G.S. 160A-102 may be adopted at the same meeting as the public hearing, and any referendum on the change under G.S. 160A-103 shall not apply to the municipal election in 2001 or 2002;2011 or 2012.

The second Public Hearing, scheduled for 23 April 2012, was postponed to allow more time to receive applications and rescheduled for 14 May 2012.



Executive Summary

City Council approved, via Resolution 12-18, the application for a State Revolving Fund Grant/Loan at the 27 February 2012 Council meeting for the Sandy Creek Pump Station Improvements.

On 3 April 2012, The City received notification from the Infrastructure Finance Section (IFS), (formerly the Construction Grants and Loan Section), that the City's application had been reviewed and the Sandy Creek Pump Station Improvements Project found eligible to receive a

low interest CWSRF loan in the amount of \$1,800,000, of which \$900,000 is in the form of principal forgiveness, with the balance at the prevailing CWSRF interest rate at the time of approval by the Local Government Commission (LGC).

In order to proceed with this project, the City must meet the deadlines as outlined in the chart below:

This project is needed for several reasons. It has been determined that there is under performance of the pump station due to slippage between the magnetic drive and pump shafts and due to the age of the facility components, many of the parts have to be custom built. With the performance of the pumps, the lower discharge velocity within the force main may cause solids to build up within the main, thus providing a lower flow capacity within the main. As a result, there is a potential for more sewer overflows and overloading of the station during wet weather.

It is proposed that the funding for the Preliminary Engineering Report be taken from sources as outlined in the budget amendment with the remaining cost (excluding the closing fee) coming from the loan amount.



During the Capital Improvements Planning process, the need for an upgrade was identified at the City of Henderson's Sandy Creek Pump Station. Through meetings with staff and Council, it was determined that McGill Associates would prepare and submit a Clean Water SRF application to the Infrastructure Finance Section (IFS) of the NC DENR for this important project. The funding application for this project has recently been determined eligible to receive a SRF loan in the amount of \$1,800,000, including \$900,000 of principal forgiveness and \$900,000 of low interest loan. The next milestone to remain eligible for this funding is to submit the Engineering Report (ER) and Environmental Information Document (EID) to IFS by July 2, 2012.

Pursuant to your request, we are pleased to provide you with this Proposal for Engineering Services for the proposed project. This proposal includes the preparation of the ER and EID in accordance with IFS's *Guidance for the Preparation of ERs and EIDs*.

The Sandy Creek Basin collects wastewater from the southeast section of the City at the Sandy Creek Pump Station with a combination of gravity sewers and intermediate pump stations. The Sandy Creek Pump Station, which is the largest lift station in the system, is overloaded during wet weather and unreliable. The pump station includes equipment and components that have exceeded their useful life and are subject to failure. Previous pump testing by the City indicated that the existing pumps are flowing much lower than originally designed. Pump equipment issues have resulted in slower pumps resulting in lower flows and solids depositing in the force main. Consequently, raw sewage backs up in the Sandy Creek system, eventually resulting in overflows.

The proposed project includes improvements to two aged and inefficient pumps, motors and drives, electrical system, site, and related appurtenances. The proposed pumping, equipment, electrical, and facility improvements will address frequent maintenance and repair issues. The improvements will provide a more reliable pumping system to allow proper pumping of raw

wastewater at the original conditions. The project will increase the operational effectiveness and reliability of the station to ensure the pump station remains in operation.






