WHEREAS, the period of performance for these funds will be July 1, 2012 to June 30, 2013 regardless of the date on which ROAP funds are disbursed to the county.

NOW, THEREFORE, by signing below, the duly authorized representatives of the County of Vance, North Carolina certify that the following statements are true and accurate:

- The county employed a documented methodology for sub-allocating ROAP funds that involved the participation of eligible agencies and citizens. Outreach efforts to include the participation of the elderly and individuals with disabilities, persons with limited English proficiency, minorities and low income persons in the county's sub-allocation decision have been documented.
- The county will advise any sub-recipients about the source of the ROAP funds, specific program requirements and restrictions, eligible program expenses and reporting requirements. The county will be responsible for invoicing any sub-recipients for unexpended ROAP funds as needed.

Position Vacancies. (A) The Animal Shelter has a position vacancy for an Animal Control Officer. (B) The Sheriff's Office has a position vacancy for a Deputy Specialist (Detective). This position is needed in order to combat the element of crime in the county as well as to assist others. (C) The Senior Center has a position vacancy for a Program Assistant V. The position plays a vital role in the day-to-day operations of the center. (D) Social Services has a position vacancy for an Income Maintenance Caseworker II. The position is in Family & Children's Medicaid, carrying a caseload determining eligibility for a variety of Medicaid programs and taking applications for Medicaid Programs when workload demands. Committee Recommendation: [Recommendations are contingent upon endorsement by the Human Resources Committee.] Authorize the staff to fill the vacant positions as requested.

B. Education Committee

Representatives of this Committee met on Thursday, May 24, to consider two items regarding education. The first was a request from Ms. Deryl von Williams for a *letter* of support for an application for her organization, Vance County Learning Center, to become a recognized charter school. The Committee directed the Manager to check with the Schools Superintendent regarding the Vance County Schools' position on the matter. Barring any information from the Schools that would be significant enough to reconsider, the Committee was in concurrence to recommend an appropriate letter that could be sent to the Department of Instruction. The Committee discussed a request from the Board of Education regarding the use of loan proceeds remaining from the Clarke Elementary School project and a portion of reserves from the Schools' Capital Outlay Fund for renovation of the first floor of the currently vacant building at Eaton Johnson Elementary School to accommodate the new STEM program. All Committee members emphasized their strong support for the STEM program. After discussion about concern of reopening and renovating part of a vacant building, a majority of the Committee agreed to recommend approval of the Board of Education's request to the full Board of Commissioners.

C. Planning & Environmental Committee

This Committee met on Friday, May 25 to review information regarding marketing of the houses recently constructed through the Neighborhood Stabilization Program. The Board of Commissioners previously delegated authority to the Committee to implement such a strategy to sell those homes to buyers as identified in the NSP regulations. The Committee reviewed a draft Request for Proposals for marketing strategies and related services. A follow-up meeting was held on Thursday, May 31 to review the final RFP that will be advertised and distributed to qualified parties. The Committee intends to recommend the selection of a real estate professional to the Board of Commissioners in its July meeting.

Section 1. The project authorized is the development of Semprius, Inc. and other future economic development projects to be financed by federal, state, and local grants and reserves.

Section 2. The officers of this unit are hereby directed to proceed with the economic development projects within the terms of the grant documents and the budget contained herein.

Section 6. Funds may be advanced from the General Fund for the purpose of making payments as due. Reimbursement requests should be made to the grantor agency in an orderly and timely manner.

Section 7. The Finance Director is directed to report, on a monthly basis, on the financial status of each project element in Section 3 and on the total grant revenues received or claimed.

Section 8. The Budget Officer is directed to include a detailed analysis of past and future costs and revenues on this economic development project in every budget submission made to this Board.

Section 9. Copies of this economic development project ordinance shall be furnished to the Clerk to the Governing Board, and to the Budget Officer and the Finance Director for direction in carrying out the project.

County Water Project. Phase 1A. Contracts with H.G. Reynolds Construction for water line installation, and with Caldwell Tanks for construction of a 200,000 gallon water tank have been executed by the County and are receiving a final review from USDA Rural Development. Upon USDA signing of the contracts, a pre-construction conference will be scheduled on June 13 or 14 with the appropriate parties. The Water Board also selected a highly experienced firm, Envirolink, to conduct its operation and maintenance services. A contract is currently being developed with that company. Some additional sign-ups continue Phase 1B. The Kittrell Water Association and USDA continue to work together to seek funding for Phase 1B, consistent with action taken by the Commissioners in December 2009. *Phases 2A & 2B*. Funding from USDA Rural Development has been established for both of these phases. Phase 2A will be funded with \$2.2 million in loans and \$1.62 million in grants. Phase 2B has \$3.94 million in loans and \$1.99 million in grants. USDA Rural Development has been notified that these ARRA funds must be spent on an accelerated schedule - by September 30, 2012. This represents a three-year difference in time (previously September 30, 2015). An extension request has been submitted to USDA Rural Development to ensure that the project can be appropriately completed. Project design is complete and has been submitted to the appropriate regulatory agencies. Permit applications will be submitted by the middle of June. Highway right-of-way encroachment agreements with NC DOT have been prepared for execution. Submittal of application information to USDA Rural Development is currently being done for both phases. A potential site for a second water tank in the area covered by Phase 2A has been identified and is being evaluated and surveyed. Due to the timing of the funding of Phases 2A & 2B, it will be important that work on these phases begin as soon as possible. A water purchase agreement with the City continues under negotiation. The approved O&M services contract will cover Phases 2A and 2B in addition to 1A. Additional sign-ups are essential in Phases 2A and 2B due to the current lack of substantial customer concentration.

Back-up 911 Center. The back-up 911 center construction project continues on schedule and should be completed by the June 30th deadline. Insulation and sheet rock have just been installed, the sprinkler system will be installed during the first week in June, the fire alarm and security systems are in place, etc. In response to a request from the County, the NC 911 Board has approved an additional \$144,000 in the County's annual allotment to assist with operational costs for the back-up PSAP and other E911 related costs. An application for PSAP grant funding for radio consoles in the amount of \$224,000 (no local match) has been submitted to the NC 911 Board. Separate pricing on all telecommunications equipment and secondary systems has been obtained, and installation will begin after construction is completed. It is anticipated that the construction phase of the project will be completed by June 30, 2012 and the center will be equipped, programmed, and operational prior to the end of the calendar year.

A. World Elder Abuse Awareness Day. As a means of bringing greater awareness to the growing problem of abuse and neglect of senior citizens, June 15th is nationally recognized as World Elder Abuse Awareness Day. The Adult Protective Services Unit of the Vance County Department of Social Services is working diligently to bring a greater awareness to this great social problem throughout Henderson and Vance County. Recommendation: Adopt the resolution as requested by the Vance County Department of Social Services to designate Friday, June 15, 2012 as World Elder Abuse Awareness Day in Vance County.

B. July County Commissioners' Meeting. Inasmuch as the next regular monthly meeting of the Board of County Commissioners is scheduled for Monday, July 2nd, which is in traditionally observed vacation week of July 4th, it would be appropriate for the Board to discuss if it wishes to meet as scheduled on July 2nd or perhaps on Monday, July 9th. **Recommendation:** If the Board of Commissioners wishes to meet on the first Monday in July, no action is necessary. If it elects to change the meeting date, approval of a resolution is required.

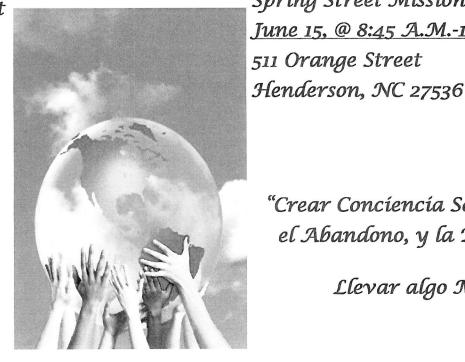

Economic Development Project Ordinance

BE IT ORDAINED by the Governing Board of the County of Vance, North Carolina, that, pursuant to Section 13.2 of Chapter 159 of the General Statutes of North Carolina, the following economic development project ordinance is hereby adopted:

- Section 1. The project authorized is the development of Semprius, Inc. and other future economic development projects to be financed by federal, state, and local grants and reserves.
- Section 2. The officers of this unit are hereby directed to proceed with the economic development projects within the terms of the grant documents and the budget contained herein.

Section 3. The following amounts are appropriated for the project:

Section 4. The following revenues are anticipated to be available to complete this project:

- Section 5. The Finance Director is hereby directed to maintain within the Economic Development Project Fund sufficient detailed accounting records to satisfy the requirements of the grantor agency, the grant agreements, and federal regulations.
- Section 6. Funds may be advanced from the General Fund for the purpose of making payments as due. Reimbursement requests should be made to the grantor agency in an orderly and timely manner.
- Section 7. The Finance Director is directed to report, on a monthly basis, on the financial status of each project element in Section 3 and on the total grant revenues received or claimed.
- Section 8. The Budget Officer is directed to include a detailed analysis of past and future costs and revenues on this economic development project in every budget submission made to this Board.
- Section 9. Copies of this economic development project ordinance shall be furnished to the Clerk to the Governing Board, and to the Budget Officer and the Finance Director for direction in carrying out the project.

County Water Project. *Phase 1A*. Contracts with H.G. Reynolds Construction for water line installation, and with Caldwell Tanks for construction of a 200,000 gallon water tank have been executed by the County and are receiving a final review from USDA Rural Development. Upon USDA signing of the contracts, a pre-construction conference will be scheduled on June 13 or 14 with the appropriate parties. The Water Board also selected a highly experienced firm, Envirolink, to conduct its operation and maintenance services. A contract is currently being developed with that company. Some additional sign-ups continue Phase 1B. The Kittrell Water Association and USDA continue to work to be received. together to seek funding for Phase 1B, consistent with action taken by the Commissioners in December 2009. *Phases 2A & 2B*. Funding from USDA Rural Development has been established for both of these phases. Phase 2A will be funded with \$2.2 million in loans and \$1.62 million in grants. Phase 2B has \$3.94 million in loans and \$1.99 million in grants. USDA Rural Development has been notified that these ARRA funds must be spent on an accelerated schedule - by September 30, 2012. This represents a three-year difference in time (previously September 30, 2015). An extension request has been submitted to USDA Rural Development to ensure that the project can be appropriately completed. Project design is complete and has been submitted to the appropriate regulatory agencies. Permit applications will be submitted by the middle of June. Highway right-of-way encroachment agreements with NC DOT have been prepared for execution. Submittal of application information to USDA Rural Development is currently being done for both phases. A potential site for a second water tank in the area covered by Phase 2A has been identified and is being evaluated and surveyed. Due to the timing of the funding of Phases 2A & 2B, it will be important that work on these phases begin as soon as possible. A water purchase agreement with the City continues under negotiation. The approved O&M services contract will cover Phases 2A and 2B in addition to 1A. Additional sign-ups are essential in Phases 2A and 2B due to the current lack of substantial customer concentration.

Back-up 911 Center. The back-up 911 center construction project continues on schedule and should be completed by the June 30th deadline. Insulation and sheet rock have just been installed, the sprinkler system will be installed during the first week in June, the fire alarm and security systems are in place, etc. In response to a request from the County, the NC 911 Board has approved an additional \$144,000 in the County's annual allotment to assist with operational costs for the back-up PSAP and other E911 related costs. An application for PSAP grant funding for radio consoles in the amount of \$224,000 (no local match) has been submitted to the NC 911 Board. Separate pricing on all telecommunications equipment and secondary systems has been obtained, and installation will begin after construction is completed. It is anticipated that the construction phase of the project will be completed by June 30, 2012 and the center will be equipped, programmed, and operational prior to the end of the calendar year.

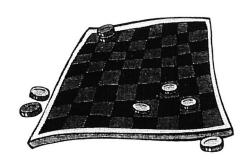
