# County Manager's Report

#### Vance County County Manager's Report to the Board July 9, 2012

- **A. Resolution of Appreciation.** After over 24 years of service, Randy Ball has officially retired as Soil & Water Technician for the Vance County Soil & Water Conservation District. The enclosed resolution appropriately recognizes Mr. Ball for his outstanding service to the citizens of Vance County. **Recommendation:** Adopt the enclosed resolution in honor of and appreciation for Mr. Ball's outstanding service to Vance County.
- **B.** Contracts for VFDs and Rescue Squad. As discussed during budget work sessions, it is necessary to enter into new contracts with the Volunteer Fire Departments and the Rescue Squad. These contracts address various items of interest as expressed by the Board. The Public Safety Committee, Fire Marshal, County Attorney, and County Manager have reviewed the contracts. **Recommendation:** Approve the contracts for the Volunteer Fire Departments and the Vance County Rescue Squad as endorsed by the Public Safety Committee and authorize the Chairman to execute them.
- C. Economic Development Project Agreement. The Board of Commissioners committed to provide a local incentive to Semprius, Inc. in the form of an economic development grant as a means of recruiting the company to Vance County. The formal document needs approval by the Board of County Commissioners. Recommendation: Approve the proposed document with Semprius for provision of local economic development grant incentives in return for creation of jobs and increase in the County's property tax base. Authorize the Chairman to execute the document.

Fire Protection Contract

This Contract, made and entered into this day of, 2012, by and between Vance County, a political subdivision of the State of North Carolina, hereinafter referred to as the County, and the Volunteer VFD, Incorporated, a non-profit corporation existing under the laws of the State of North Carolina,
hereinafter referred to as the VFD;

Now therefore, in consideration of the mutual promises contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the parties hereto contract and agree as follows:

- 1) The County agrees that it will cause to be assessed or levied a special fire tax within statutory limits of the County; and will collect said fire tax as a part of the ad valorem taxes of the Vance County.
- 2) The County will compensate each of the VFD an equal sum to be determined annually during the County's budgeting process, payable monthly on or before the 10<sup>th</sup> day of each month during the term of this agreement, as compensation for providing fire protection and prevention service to those citizens living in the VFD's Fire District, which includes \_\_\_\_\_\_.
- 3) This agreement shall become effective the 1<sup>st</sup> day of July, 2012 and remain in effect for a period not to exceed one year, subject to the continued legal existence of the Fire District and the VFD, the agreements and requirements and the termination provisions herein
- 4) Funds levied and collected by the County and paid to the VFD by the County shall be used for VFD operations which shall generally include fire protection and emergency services in the VFD's Fire District and other areas of response as dispatched by County and to meet the requirements established by this agreement as follows
  - a. The VFD will furnish fire protection and related emergency services, as authorized by the Board of Directors of the VFD, within the Fire District and shall provide the necessary equipment, personnel, training and those things necessary for furnishing such protection in the Fire District. The services shall be in accordance with minimum standards set forth in this agreement and all future amendments adopted in accordance with this agreement. The VFD shall furnish said fire protection without charge to all persons and property located in the Fire District in an efficient and workmanlike manner. This provision shall not prohibit the VFD from recouping costs and expense from incidents or from entering into contracts with the Federal, State, or local governments or utility companies for the provisions of emergency protection services for a fee.
  - b. The VFD shall provide to the County Finance Officer an annual audit and accompanying management letter prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and generally accepted auditing standards for the preceding fiscal year no later than 5:00PM on the last working day of October of the current fiscal year. The County agrees, upon the timely written request of the VFD, to make available any audit conducted at the VFD expense by an independent certified public accountant.

- c. The VFD also agrees to secure and maintain a blanket bond on all persons who have access to or authority to disburse funds belonging to the VFD. Such blanket bond shall be in the amount of not less than the revenues to be distributed by the County to the VFD as approved by the County for the upcoming year. Proof of such bonding shall be provided to the County prior to the disbursement of any funds by the County to the VFD. The VFD shall follow the applicable statutory procedures for letting of public contracts for fire apparatus, equipment, and construction.
- d. The VFD shall submit an annual budget to the Vance County Fire Marshal no later than the last business day of February each year, containing financial needs of the VFD for the upcoming fiscal year commencing the 1<sup>st</sup> day of July. Budget requests must be in writing with all supporting documentation and justification. The Fire Marshal shall review all budget requests and upon review, provide a recommendation to the County Manager and County Commissioners for consideration. The VFD shall promptly provide any additional information or documentation that may be requested by County.
- e. The VFD shall obtain and keep in force during the term of this contract the following minimum insurance coverage:
  - i. Worker's Compensation
    - 1. Coverage for all paid and volunteer emergency workers for statutory limits in compliance with applicable state and federal laws.
    - 2. Comprehensive General Liability, Malpractice and Errors and Omissions
  - ii. \$100,000.00 for property damage per occurrence
  - iii. \$500,000.00 for property damage aggregate
  - iv. \$500,000.00 for personal bodily injury to any one person; and
  - v. \$1,000,000.00 for bodily injury aggregate per single accident or occurrence.
  - vi. Business Auto Policy
    - 1. \$1,000,000.00 for bodily injury and consequent death per occurrence
    - 2. \$500,000.00 for bodily injury and consequent death to any one person; and
    - 3. \$500,000.00 for property damage per occurrence.
- f. VFD shall furnish the County a certificate of insurance annually on or before July 1, of each year, and will further insure that the county receives notice in the event said policy or policies are to be cancelled.
- g. The VFD acknowledges that they are separate and apart from all departments of the County, and agrees to fully indemnify and hold harmless the County, its officers, agents, employees, boards, commissions, and agencies against all loss, liability, claims or actions for damages to persons or property arising out of omissions of the VFD, its employees, or agents, or to which the VFD's negligence shall in any way contribute.

- h. The VFD shall maintain a minimum of a 9S rating or better with the North Carolina Department of Insurance, Office of State Fire Marshal, as well as its corporation's status in good standing pursuant to Chapter 55A of the North Carolina General Statues. The VFD shall continuously comply with all applicable laws, ordinances, and State regulations. The Vance County Fire Marshal shall conduct an annual inspection of the department to verify that these standards are being met.
- i. The VFD shall maintain a copy of all emergency responses for a minimum of five (5) years and shall provide upon request a copy of same to the Vance County Fire Marshal's Office or other appropriate agency. The VFD shall submit fire reports electronically to OSFM in a timely manner, utilizing NFIRS Incident Reporting software.
- j. The VFD shall provide annually to the Vance County Fire Marshal's Office a current and complete roster of members of the VFD to include contact numbers for the Chief and Assistant Chief(s), and shall update the list throughout the year as changes occur.
- k. The VFD shall be responsible for the training of all its personnel in accordance with the rules and regulations of the North Carolina Office of state Fire Marshal, North Carolina Office of Emergency Medical Service, Vance County EMS First Responder Program and other federal, state and local agencies or otherwise with commonly accepted professional standards, so as to qualify such personnel to perform the services required by this contract.
- 1. The VFD will be required annually to join and maintain their membership in good standing with the Vance County Firemen's Association. The VFD will be required to attend and to participate in the Vance County Firemen's Association meetings and shall be required to attend a minimum of eight (8) Association meetings. If the department misses a meeting it shall be the VFD's Fire Chief's responsibility to obtain any information that was discussed at the meeting from the President.
- m. The VFD agrees to provide automatic and mutual aid services to other emergency services providers in Vance County and as requested or dispatch by County. The VFD understands that other agencies will maintain their own liability policies and be responsible for their own expenses. The VFD further agrees that it will be responsible for its own expenses while responding mutual aid to another agency within the county. The current automatic aid agreement is included in Appendix A of this contract.
  - In areas where the district has been extended to six miles, the VFD agrees to maintain agreements with adjoining districts to respond with a minimum of one apparatus capable of transporting a minimum of 1,000 gallons of water to all alarms involving reported structure fires. This apparatus will be dispatched simultaneously with the department whose district the incident is occurring within.
- The following minimal performance standards are agreed upon by the County and the VFD and are part of this contract:
  - The VFD shall comply with the procedures for radio communications and established protocols for the dispatch of emergencies as defined by the Vance County Communications Center Protocols.
  - The VFD officer in charge at all fire scenes shall contact the Vance County Fire Marshal's Office if needed to determine the origin and cause of every fire.

- iii. The VFD shall keep all records on site for minimum period of five (5) years. All State and County required reports and rosters shall be submitted by the requested deadlines.
- iv. If pressurized fire hydrants are located within the district, the VFD shall adhere to the guidelines established by the City of Henderson Public Utilities Department for the flowing and or flushing of hydrants. The VFD shall immediately report any malfunctions or damage to hydrants to the entity owning the water system.
- v. The VFD shall follow the Vance County Emergency Operations Plan when responding to an emergency or disaster.
- vi. During a declared State of Emergency affecting the County the VFD shall assist, within the limits of its personnel and equipment and capabilities and with deference to its primary response district, to the extent possible with the following services:
  - 1. Debris removal from roadways;
  - 2. Traffic Control:
  - 3. Alert and notification:
  - 4. Search and rescue:
  - 5. Evacuation;
  - 6. other life saving and property protection measures as necessary or requested by County.

Request for additional assistance outside the primary response district shall be directed to the VFD's Fire Chief or designee. All operations shall be in accordance with the Vance County Emergency Operations Plan.

- vii. The VFD should annually have a public fire/life safety education program or similar activities for, at a minimum, educating persons regarding life safety from fire.
- o. When determining the need and location of additional facilities (fire stations, etc.), the VFD shall participate in a planning process involving the County Fire Marshal which evaluates, at a minimum, the needs of the County and others departments, the effects on property owners, the effects on insurance grading and the impacts on adjoining fire districts.
- p. In addition to those services required herein, each VFD may elect to voluntarily participate in certain additional services. Each department that provides these services shall be contracted or franchised for the operation of such service, pursuant to the rules set forth by the Vance County Board of Commissioners. Vance County recognizes that responses to these calls are within the limits of its available personnel. If the VFD has chosen to participate in any of these programs, the agreements can be found as Appendices of this contract:

- 5) The County Finance Director or his appointee may inspect the financial books and records of the VFD at reasonable times during regular business hours of the County. The VFD agrees, upon request, to supply such financial books, records and information or verification as may be reasonably requested by the County. The VFD shall maintain a written accounting system which provides adequate documentation of all of its receipts and disbursements including, but not limited to, those related to the expenditure of funds received pursuant to this agreement.
- 6) All requests for loans that require a resolution of support by the Board of Commissioners must be presented to the Vance County Fire Marshal with a copy to the Vance County Manager 45 days prior to the Board adopting the resolution. The Fire Marshal will review all resolution requests for recommendation to the Board of Commissioners. The VFD must submit all supporting documentation for justification of such loans, and the project source of funds to pay for such indebtedness.
- 7) The VFD, during the period of this contract is in effect, shall remain incorporated and do business as a private non-profit corporation under the provisions of the North Carolina Non-Profit Corporation Act. A true copy of the Articles of Incorporation, existing By-Laws, and any changes made from time-to-time to either will be filed with the County. The VFD will adopt By-Laws, which meet all minimum legal requirements of said Act. The By-Laws shall vest in a Board of Directors the authority to manage the affairs of the corporation to the extent permitted by said Act. The VFD Board of Directors shall be representative of the citizens within the fire district and are encouraged to include non-member citizens.
- 8) In the event of a liquidation or dissolution of the VFD, all equipment and assets will be distributed in accordance with the VFD's Charter and the Internal Revenue Service Nonprofit 501(c)(3) Corporation Act. In the event there is no plan for distribution of assets, all assets and equipment shall be dispersed to other departments at the request of the County.
- 9) Failure to provide protection or meet conditions as contemplated in this contract may result in the County withholding any and all funds unless a plan for compliance or resolution is made.
- 10) This agreement may not be transferred or assigned by the VFD, nor may the services contracted for herein be sub-contracted to other parties unless approved by Vance County.
- 11) This contract may be terminated by either party upon advance notification to the other party by certified mail at least sixty (60) days prior to termination.
- 12) Either party may propose an amendment to this agreement by submitting the amendment in writing at least sixty (60) days in advance of the amendment's proposed effective date. Amendments to this agreement must be approved by both the County and the VFD prior to becoming effective.
- 13) If any part of this Contract is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, that part shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and the holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Contract.
- 14) This contract is not intended to serve for the benefit of any third party. The rights and obligations contained herein belong exclusively to the entities that are partied hereto and no third party shall rely upon anything contained herein as a benefit to that third party.

15) The terms and provisions herein contained constitute the entire agreement by and between the County and the VFD and shall supersede all previous communications, representations, or agreements, either oral or written between the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter hereof.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, the County has caused this instrument to be executed by the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners and attested by the Clerk to the Board of County Commissioners, and the VFD has caused this instrument to be signed in its name by its President, attested by its Secretary, all by the authorization of its Board of Directors duly given.

The VFD first responders will respond to the scene of a medical emergency when dispatched by Vance County Communications. D. The VFD will assure that all first responder designated personnel receive adequate first responder training annually (24 hours). Now therefore, in consideration of the mutual promises contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the parties hereto contract and agree as follows:

- 1) The County will fund the Rescue Squad an amount to be determined annually during the County's budgeting process, payable monthly on or before the 15<sup>th</sup> day of each month during the term of this agreement, as compensation for providing rescue service to those citizens living in Vance County.
- 2) This agreement shall become effective the 1<sup>st</sup> day of July, 2012 and remain in effect for a period not to exceed two years, subject to the continued legal existence of the Rescue Squad, annual allocation of funds by the County, and the agreements, requirements, and termination provisions herein.
- 3) Funds paid to the Rescue Squad by the County shall be used for Rescue Squad operations which shall generally include rescue services within Vance County, other areas of response as determined and dispatched by the County, and to meet the requirements established by this agreement as follows:
  - a. The Rescue Squad will furnish rescue services, as authorized by the Board of Directors of the Rescue Squad, within Vance County, and shall provide the necessary equipment, personnel, training and those things necessary for furnishing such services in Vance County. The services shall be in accordance with minimum standards set forth in this agreement and all future amendments adopted in accordance with this agreement. The Rescue Squad shall furnish said rescue services without charge to all persons and property located in Vance County in an efficient and workmanlike manner. This provision shall not prohibit the Rescue Squad from recouping costs and expense from incidents or from entering into contracts with the Federal, State, or local governments or utility companies for the provisions of emergency protection services for a fee.
  - b. The Rescue Squad shall provide to the County Finance Director an annual audit and accompanying management letter prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and generally accepted auditing standards for the preceding fiscal year no later than the last working day of October of the current fiscal year. The County agrees, upon the timely written request of the Rescue Squad, to make available any audit conducted at the Rescue Squad expense by an independent certified public accountant.
  - c. The Rescue Squad also agrees to secure and maintain a blanket bond on all persons who have access to or authority to disburse funds belonging to the Rescue Squad. Such blanket bond shall be in the amount of not less than the revenues to be distributed by the County to the Rescue Squad as approved by the County for the upcoming year. Proof of such bonding shall be provided to the County prior to the disbursement of any funds by the County to the Rescue Squad. The Rescue Squad shall follow the applicable statutory procedures for letting of public contracts for fire apparatus, equipment, and construction.

- d. The Rescue Squad shall submit an annual budget to the Vance County Fire Marshal no later than the last business day of February each year, containing financial needs of the Rescue Squad for the upcoming fiscal year. Budget requests must be in writing with all supporting documentation and justification. The Fire Marshal shall review all budget requests and upon review, provide a recommendation to the County Manager for consideration. The Rescue Squad shall promptly provide any additional information or documentation that may be requested by the County.
- e. The Rescue Squad shall obtain and keep in force during the term of this contract the following minimum insurance coverage:
  - i. Worker's Compensation
    - 1. Coverage for all paid and volunteer emergency workers for statutory limits in compliance with applicable state and federal laws.
    - 2. Comprehensive General Liability, Malpractice and Errors and Omissions
  - ii. \$100,000.00 for property damage per occurrence
  - iii. \$500,000.00 for property damage aggregate
  - iv. \$500,000.00 for personal bodily injury to any one person; and
  - v. \$1,000,000.00 for bodily injury aggregate per single accident or occurrence.
  - vi. Business Auto Policy
    - 1. \$1,000,000.00 for bodily injury and consequent death per occurrence
    - 2. \$500,000.00 for bodily injury and consequent death to any one person; and
    - 3. \$500,000.00 for property damage per occurrence.
- f. Rescue Squad shall furnish the County a certificate of insurance on or before July 1, of each year, and will further ensure that the County receives notice in the event said policy or policies are to be cancelled.
- g. The Rescue Squad acknowledges that it is separate and apart from all other departments of the County, and agrees to fully indemnify and hold harmless the County, its officers, agents, employees, boards, commissions, and agencies against all loss, liability, claims or actions for damages to persons or property arising out of omissions of the Rescue Squad, its employees, or agents, or to which the Rescue Squad's negligence shall in any way contribute.
- h. The Rescue Squad shall maintain a copy of all emergency responses for a minimum of five (5) years and shall provide upon request a copy of same to the Vance County Fire Marshal or other appropriate County agency.
- i. The Rescue Squad shall provide annually to the Vance County Fire Marshal a current and complete roster of members of the Rescue Squad to include contact information for the Chief and Assistant Chief(s), and shall update the list throughout the year as changes occur.

- j. The Rescue Squad shall be responsible for the training of all its personnel in accordance with the rules and regulations of the North Carolina Office of state Fire Marshal, North Carolina Office of Emergency Medical Service, Vance County EMS First Responder Program and other federal, state and local agencies or otherwise with commonly accepted professional standards, so as to qualify such personnel to perform the services required by this contract.
- k. The Rescue Squad shall be responsible to maintain certifications in Heavy Rescue, Vehicle Extrication, High Angle Rescue, Water Rescue, and all other appropriate rescue programs in accordance with requirements set forth by the North Carolina Rescue Association.
- 1. The Rescue Squad will be required annually to join and maintain their membership in good standing with the Vance County Firemen's Association. The Rescue Squad will be required to attend and actively participate in the Vance County Firemen's Association meetings and shall be required to attend a minimum of eight (8) Association meetings annually. If the Rescue Squad misses a meeting, it shall be the Rescue Squad Chief's responsibility to obtain information that was discussed from the President.
- m. The Rescue Squad agrees to provide automatic and mutual aid services to other emergency services providers in Vance County and as requested or dispatched by the County. The Rescue Squad understands that other agencies will maintain their own liability policies and be responsible for their own expenses. The Rescue Squad further agrees that it will be responsible for its own expenses while providing mutual aid to other agencies within the County. The current automatic aid agreement is included in Appendix A of this contract.
- n. The following minimal performance standards are agreed upon by the County and the Rescue Squad and are part of this contract:
  - i. The Rescue Squad shall comply with the procedures for radio communications and established protocols for the dispatch of emergencies as defined by the Vance County Communications Center Protocols.
  - ii. The Rescue Squad shall keep all records on site for a minimum period of five (5) years. All State and County required reports and rosters shall be submitted by the requested deadlines.
  - iii. The Rescue Squad shall follow the Vance County Emergency Operations Plan when responding to an emergency or disaster.
  - iv. During a declared State of Emergency affecting the County, at the direction of the County, the Rescue Squad shall assist, within the limits of its personnel and equipment and capabilities and with deference to its primary response district, to the extent possible with the following services:
    - 1. Debris removal from roadways;
    - 2. Traffic Control;
    - 3. Alert and notification;
    - 4. Search and rescue;
    - 5. Evacuation;
    - 6. Other life saving and property protection measures as necessary or requested by the County.

- o. When determining the need and location of new and/or additional facilities (stations, etc.), the Rescue Squad shall participate in a planning process involving the County Fire Marshal which evaluates, at a minimum, the needs of the County.
- 4) The County Finance Director or his appointee may inspect the financial books and records of the Rescue Squad at reasonable times during regular business hours of the County. The Rescue Squad agrees, upon request, to supply such financial books, records and information or verification as may be reasonably requested by the County. The Rescue Squad shall maintain a written accounting system which provides adequate documentation of all of its receipts and disbursements including, but not limited to, those related to the expenditure of funds received pursuant to this agreement.
- 5) All requests for loans that require a resolution of support by the Board of Commissioners must be presented to the Vance County Fire Marshal with a copy to the Vance County Manager 45 days prior to the Board adopting the resolution. The Fire Marshal will review all resolution requests for recommendation to the Board of Commissioners. The Rescue Squad must submit all supporting documentation for justification of such loans, and the projected source of funds to pay for such indebtedness. The County will not be responsible for any indebtedness incurred by the Rescue Squad or its agents.
- 6) The Rescue Squad, during the period of this contract is in effect, shall remain incorporated and do business as a private non-profit corporation under the provisions of the North Carolina Non-Profit Corporation Act. A true copy of the Articles of Incorporation, existing By-Laws, and any changes made from time-to-time to either will be filed with the County. The Rescue Squad will adopt By-Laws, which meet all minimum legal requirements of said Act. The By-Laws shall vest in a Board of Directors the authority to manage the affairs of the corporation to the extent permitted by said Act. The Rescue Squad Board of Directors shall be representative of the citizens within the fire district and are encouraged to include non-member citizens.
- 7) In the event of a liquidation or dissolution of the Rescue Squad, all equipment and assets will be distributed in accordance with the Rescue Squad's Charter and the Internal Revenue Service Nonprofit 501(c)(3) Corporation Act. In the event there is no plan for distribution of assets, all assets and equipment shall be dispersed to other departments at the direction of the County.
- 8) Failure to provide protection or meet conditions as contemplated in this contract may result in the County withholding any and all funds not disbursed to the Rescue Squad unless an acceptable plan for compliance or resolution is developed and provided to County by the deadline provided by the County.
- 9) This agreement may not be transferred or assigned by the Rescue Squad, nor may the services contracted for herein be sub-contracted to other parties unless approved in advance by the County.
- 10) This contract may be terminated by either party upon advance notification to the other party by certified mail at least sixty (60) days prior to termination. Upon notification of intent to terminate, funding by the County will cease and the Rescue Squad shall have no right to receive any remaining funds or budget balances.
- 11) Either party may propose an amendment to this agreement by submitting the amendment in writing at least sixty (60) days in advance of the amendment's proposed effective date. Amendments to this agreement must be approved by both the County and the Rescue Squad prior to becoming effective.

- 12) If any part of this Contract is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, that part shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and the holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Contract.
- 13) This contract is not intended to serve for the benefit of any third party. The rights and obligations contained herein belong exclusively to the entities that are partied hereto and no third party shall rely upon anything contained herein as a benefit to that third party.
- 14) The terms and provisions herein contained constitute the entire agreement by and between the County and the Rescue Squad and shall supersede all previous communications, representations, or agreements, either oral or written between the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter hereof.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, the County has caused this instrument to be executed by the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners and attested by the Clerk to the Board of County Commissioners, and the Vance County Rescue Squad has, after proper approval and authority, caused this instrument to be signed in its name by its President, attested by its Secretary, all by the authorization of its Board of Directors duly given.

WHEREAS, the Rescue Squad is currently under contract with Vance County to provide rescue services pursuant to separate agreements and is a participant in the Vance County Mutual Aid Agreement; and,

WHEREAS, the Rescue Squad voluntarily agrees to accept these rescue duties for its designated geographic area; and.

NOW THEREFORE, let it be resolved that the Vance County Rescue Squad agrees to become a participating party in the program(s) indicated below:

- Heavy Rescue Provider (as outlined by N.C. Association of Rescue and EMS)
- High Angle Rescue Provider (as outlined by N.C. Association of Rescue and EMS) [X]
- Surface Water Rescue Provider (as outlined by N.C. Association of Rescue and EMS) [X]

AND THEREFORE, let it be resolved that the following provisions and conditions will be in force and that the parties to this understanding agree to abide by the following:

- A. The Rescue Squad will maintain the necessary equipment to provide the service(s) indicated above.
- B. The Rescue Squad will ensure that members involved are properly trained to provide the service(s)
- C. The Rescue Squad will be available for response twenty-four hours daily to the extent possible, realizing that the number of responders may be limited.
- D. At any time Rescue Squad is unable to perform such services and programs, they shall immediately notify Vance County Fire Marshal.

# Committee Reports and Recommendations

### **Vance County Committee Reports and Recommendations** July 9, 2012

**Position Vacancies**. (A) The Jail has <u>five</u> position vacancies for *Detention Officers*. These are essential positions within the facility as to prevent staff shortages that can affect the overall operation of the facility, as well as compromise the safety of personnel and the security of the facility. (B) The Jail has two position vacancies for Detention Sergeants. These positions are needed to ensure safety and security at the facility. (C) The Sheriff's Office has a position vacancy for a Deputy Sheriff. This position is needed in order to combat the element of crime in the county as well as to assist others. (D) The 911 Operations Center has a position vacancy for a Telecommunicator I. This active position in the 911 Communications Center is critical to their ability to adequately process calls from the public and handle the call volume from the public safety agencies. Committee Recommendation: [Recommendations are contingent upon endorsement by the Human Resources Committee.] Authorize the staff to fill the vacant positions as requested.

## B. Planning & Environmental Committee

This Committee will meet on Monday, July 9 to review responses to the Request for Proposals (RFP) for provision of marketing/real estate services for the Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP). The Board of Commissioners previously delegated authority to the Committee to implement such a strategy to sell NSP homes to buyers as identified in the NSP regulations. A recommendation will be made to the full Board for selection of a real estate professional. In addition, the Committee will review a proposal to exempt approved non-profits from payment of permit fees for handicapped ramps and roofing shingle replacement projects and a proposed change in the e-waste recycling program.

## Vance County Board of Commissioners Amendment of Planning and Development Department Policies and Procedures Concerning Permit Fee Waivers

WHEREAS, Vance County charges various fees related to planning, zoning, construction and development of real property; and

**WHEREAS**, Vance County recognizes the benefits to its citizens and the value of non-profit organizations that provide home repair services to its citizens at little or no cost to the citizen.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Vance County Board of Commissioners hereby:

1. Amends the Vance County Planning and Development Department's Permitting Policy and Procedures document to include the following:

Vance County recognizes the benefits to its citizens and the value of non-profit organizations that provide home repair services to its citizens at little or no cost to the citizen.

In an effort to support and provide assistance to such entities, Vance County will waive the zoning permit fee and the construction permit fee for handicap ramp construction and shingle replacement for approved organizations.

An approved organization will be a non-profit organization having obtained 501(c)(3) or equivalent recognition from the IRS or non-profit recognition from NC Department of Revenue, and registered to do business in North Carolina. Such organizations should be able to show a history of successful home repair projects which they have performed, preferably in Vance County mainly serving elderly, disabled, and low to moderate income homeowners.

No such waiver will be requested or used for home repair projects that are performed for a profit by the approved organization, and such approval may be revoked by the County for any or no reason at any time.

Requests for waiver shall be made to the Planning and Development Department by the qualified non-profit organization and signed by its duly approved chairperson of its board and/or director. That department will then make a formal recommendation to the Board of Commissioners based on the policy amendment.

Only the Vance County Board of Commissioners shall have the authority to approve organizations, which after obtaining approval, the Planning and Development Director of their assigns shall implement this policy.

#### Pending Business July 9, 2012

County Water Project. Phase 1A. Construction begins on Monday, July 9! Unanticipated additional erosion control measures from DENR and July 4th holiday/vacations delayed startup of construction. According to H.G. Reynolds Construction Company, they expect to complete an average of about 500 feet of water line construction each day. They plan to start work on Warrenton Road in the vicinity of North Oliver Drive. During the past month, an additional 21 sign-ups were received. Some of the new sign-ups require adding more roads, which will lead to change orders to the construction contract. (Hopefully, this will be an ongoing process.) Phase 1B. The Kittrell Water Association and USDA Rural Development continue to work together to seek funding for Phase 1B, consistent with action taken by the Commissioners in December 2009. Phases 2A & 2B. Funding from USDA Rural Development has been established for both of these phases. Phase 2A will be funded with \$2.2 million in loans and \$1.62 million in grants. Phase 2B has \$3.94 million in loans and \$1.99 million in grants. USDA Rural Development has been notified that these ARRA funds must be spent on an accelerated schedule by September 30, 2012. This represents a threeyear difference in time (previously September 30, 2015). An extension(waiver) request regarding the deadline has been submitted to USDA Rural Development to ensure that the project can be appropriately completed. District and state USDA RD officials are highly supportive of granting an extension, but the final decision is made at the federal level. Project design is complete and has been submitted to the appropriate regulatory agencies. Permit applications have been submitted. Highway right-of-way encroachment agreements with NC DOT have been prepared for execution. Submittal of application information to USDA Rural Development is currently being done for both phases. A potential site for a second water tank in the area covered by Phase 2A has been identified and surveyed. Due to the timing of the funding of Phases 2A & 2B, it will be important that work on these phases begin as soon as possible. A water purchase agreement with the City continues under negotiation. The approved O&M services contract will cover Phases 2A and 2B in addition to 1A. Additional sign-ups are essential in Phases 2A and 2B due to the current lack of substantial customer concentration. Current sign-up totals are 329 for Phase 2A and 334 for Phase 2B.

Back-up 911 Center. Construction on the back-up 911 Center was completed on June 28. All of the construction-related aspects of the project have been finalized prior to the June 30 deadline, thus allowing designated 911 surcharge funds to cover 100% of the cost. Separate pricing on all telecommunications equipment and secondary systems has been obtained, and installation will begin later this summer. It is anticipated that the center will be equipped, programmed, and fully operational by October 1st (see attached update). In response to a request from the County, the NC 911 Board has approved an additional \$144,000 in the County's annual allotment to assist with operational costs for the back-up PSAP and other E911 related costs. An application for PSAP grant funding for radio consoles in the amount of \$224,000 (no local match) has been submitted to the NC 911 Board.

## Backup PSAP (911 Center) Update Vance County Board of Commissioners

July 9, 2012

The construction phase of the backup PSAP has been completed.

The E-911 telephone system upgrade at the primary 911 Center has been completed in preparation for the backup center coming online.

The Centralized UPS battery system startup for the backup center is scheduled for Monday July 9<sup>th</sup>.

The telephone equipment for the backup center is scheduled to be delivered on Tuesday, July 10<sup>th</sup>.

The furniture replacement at the primary center is scheduled for the week of July 23<sup>rd</sup>. The existing furniture will be taken to the backup center and reassembled.

We are working with the County IT Director on the installation of other computer based systems that will come online gradually over the next few months.

The project remains on schedule and in line with budget estimates.


