September 10, 2012

The Vance County Board of Education met in regular session on Monday, September 10, 2012, 7:00 p.m., Administrative Services Center Board Room. Board members present were: Gloria J. White, Chair, Darlynn P. Oxendine, Vice Chair, Emeron J. Cash, Sr., Margaret A. Ellis, Ruth M. Hartness, Ronald B. Kinsley and Dorothy M. Williams. Senior staff members present were: Ronald E. Gregory, Superintendent, Dr. Trixie J. Brooks, Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum and Instruction, Brian K. Creasman, Assistant Superintendent for Administration/Instructional Support, Steven Graham, Finance Officer, Terri Hedrick, Public Information Officer, and Jerry Stainback, Attorney for the Board. 4. Recognitions/Announcements

A. Carnetta Blakely, Transition Specialist, took a moment to welcome students, parents and community representatives to the meeting and expressed her gratitude to the businesses and organizations for their continued support in providing jobs to the Occupational Course of Study (OCS) students at Northern Vance and Southern Vance High Schools. Ms. Blakely introduced Dr. Michael Applewhite, Principal of Northern Vance High School, and requested Mr. Gregory and Dr. Brooks to assist in the presentations.

Board members thanked the businesses for their continued support of the OCS program.

5. Comments from the Public

A. Attorney Garey Ballance spoke to the Board on behalf of Rev. John Miles. Rev. Miles took a moment to distribute letters to Board members. Mr. Ballance stated that Rev. Miles had been volunteering as an athletic coach for the past six (6) years. He has done a wonderful job and been a role model for students. Rev. Miles was recently advised that he would no longer be able to volunteer as an assistant coach for football. He was told they could not use volunteer coaches any more. Coaches would be only school employees. Upon review of the Board's policy, Mr. Ballance stated the Board is not adhering to its policy regarding volunteers. The policy allows for volunteers pursuant to drug testing, background check, etc. Rev. Miles has gone through this process before and the information is on file. He is willing to go through a screening process again. If Rev. Miles is excluded then the Board needs to exclude all volunteer coaches. If not, they are prepared to file charges of discrimination. Mr. Ballance requested the Board investigate the matter. If there is a policy that prevents Rev. Miles from coaching, please provide him a copy. If not, reinstate Rev. Miles.

Mrs. White stated the policy addresses the role of volunteers. The Superintendent and Board attorney will respond.

B. Debbie Perkinson requested to speak on the number of Vance County students leaving to attend Granville County Schools. Ms. Perkinson was not in attendance.

6. Superintendent's Report

(1) Justyn Phelps, Biology Teacher at Northern Vance High School, reported on a new Biotechnology Class she is teaching this semester. The class was made possible through a \$2,200 grant from Novozymes, Inc. which was used to purchase textbooks, a teacher's manual and other teacher resources. Mrs. Phelps has also developed a partnership with Dr. Danny Monroe, head of the Bioprocess Technology Program at Vance Granville Community College. The partnership allows Mrs. Phelps to take her Biotechnology students to Vance Granville each Monday to use the Bioprocess Technology lab with assistance from Dr. Monroe. Mrs. Phelps stated she continues to work hard in seeking grants and funding to purchase needed equipment, materials and supplies for the class. She announced that the Vance County Farm Bureau has awarded her class a \$2,500 grant to purchase additional materials.

Mrs. White praised Mrs. Phelps for the great job she is doing. Mr. Gregory also thanked her and stated he wanted the Board to hear the good things going on to benefit our students.

Minutes of the Vance County Board of Education

October 1, 2012

The Vance County Board of Education met in a called meeting on Monday, October 1, 2012, 5:30 p.m., Administrative Services Center Conference Room. Board members present were: Gloria J. White, Chair, Darlynn P. Oxendine, Vice Chair, Emeron J. Cash, Sr., Margaret A. Ellis, Ruth M. Hartness, Ronald B. Kinsley and Dorothy M. Williams. Senior staff members present were: Ronald E. Gregory, Superintendent, Dr. Trixie J. Brooks, Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum and Instruction, Brian K. Creasman, Assistant Superintendent for Administration/Instructional Support, Steven Graham, Finance Officer, and Wil McLean, Executive Director for Human Resources.

- 1. Mrs. White called the meeting to order at 5:35 p.m.
- 2. Upon motion by Mrs. Hartness, second by Mrs. Oxendine, the Board unanimously (7-0) approved the meeting agenda.
- 3. Mrs. White turned the meeting over to Mr. Graham to present the 2012-2013 Fiscal Year Budget.
 - a. Child Care The proposed Child Care budget totals \$115,027. This is a decrease of \$22,473 from the 2011-2012 budget of \$137,500. Mr. Graham stated the budget is based on a projected average enrollment of 72 participants. There are 68 students currently enrolled in the program.
 - b. Child Nutrition The proposed budget of \$4,964,187 is an increase of 5.18% over the previous year's budget of \$4,719,753. The increase is due to a rise in the USDA reimbursement rate from \$2.79 to \$2.88 for free lunches, and the receipt of a grant in the amount of \$194,090 through the USDA Fresh Fruit & Vegetable program.
 - c. Capital Outlay Fund Mr. Graham briefly presented the proposed Capital Outlay Fund Budget totaling \$1,141,618 which is an increase of 58.22% from the previous year. The budget includes \$425,000 for Capital Outlay allotted by the County, \$566,106 for replacement school bus financing, \$127,431 for deferred revenue capital outlay projects, \$7,142 for deferred revenue ADM projects, \$540 for assigned fund balance appropriated and \$15,399 for unassigned fund balance appropriated. Mr. Graham stated that funds received from the lottery have decreased due to the State diverting \$16 million to cover the LEA adjustments.

Mr. Graham shared requests for Category 1: Facility Projects totaling \$205,962; Category 2: School Furniture and Equipment totaling \$11,000, Maintenance Equipment totaling \$7,800, and Custodial Equipment totaling \$35,500. There are no requests for Category 3: Maintenance Vehicles. He stated if the County issued the QZAB bonds for the three (3) roofing projects and other major work, the facility projects may be adjusted.

Mr. Gregory stated Jerry Ayscue, County Manager, is recommending the approval to issue the \$2 million QZAB Bonds for the roofing projects at the County Commissioners' Meeting this evening. He feels very strongly the recommendation will be approved.

Mrs. White inquired about the priority to paint the outside doors and window frames at Zeb Vance over removing carpet and tile in classrooms. Mr. Woods stated the outside doors were beginning to rust and needed to be protected. Mrs. White stated that the Board makes the final decisions, and she did not remember a discussion about the carpet and paint.

- d. Federal Planning allotments are used to prepare the Federal Budget due to the Federal Government's Fiscal Year which runs October through September. In addition to the planning allotments, budget carryovers from the previous year are included in the initial budget. The Federal Budget totals \$8,617,910.39, a decrease of \$1,692,381.14 from the previous year. The decrease is due to the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) funds and the Education Jobs funds ending. The Race to the Top funds are non-recurring grant funds and must be obligated over the next two (2) fiscal years.
- e. State The initial allotment for State Budget Funds for 2012-2013 is \$42,710,218. The allotment is based on an ADM (Average Daily Membership) of 6,848 compared to last year's ADM of 7,003. Mr. Graham noted the classroom teacher allotment is a positional allotment that guarantees funding for salaries. The increase in funding is due to the rise in salary and benefits. However, the reduction in allotted ADM and a discretionary reversion of \$982,783 to meet the LEA Adjustment required by legislation resulted in a loss of 7.70 positions from the previous year. Mr. Graham stated in addition to the \$982,783 being reverted, \$96,914 from textbooks, \$20,000 from teacher assistants and \$550,558 from Low Wealth were reverted for a total of \$1,650,255 to meet the required mandatory reversion.

Mrs. White inquired to the use of disks instead of textbooks. It is cheaper and would be easier on students walking around with heavy book bags. Dr. Brooks stated disks might be a little cheaper but not much. Mrs. White asked the administration to look at purchasing disks over textbooks and report back. Some savings are better than none.

f. Local - The Local Budget includes the County Appropriation – Current Expenses, Fines & Forfeitures and unassigned fund balance appropriated totaling \$7,930,596 and is known as Fund 2. The county appropriation amount of \$7,202,440 remained the same. Mr. Gregory stated in two (2) years, the school system has lost \$295,120. Board members briefly discussed the fines and forfeitures that continue to decrease. Mrs. White stated changes were made in how magistrates entered information. Hopefully, we will see the funds increase over time.

Mr. Graham stated with the state mandatory increase, the federal and local funds were impacted. This left a tremendous shortfall in the budget. He stated that the school system ended the year with a fund balance in operating expenses of 3.7 months. It is recommended a school system has a minimum of 2 months. Due to the shortfall in the budget, Mr. Graham recommended that \$478,156 of the fund balance be used to balance the 2012-2013 budget. This will still leave 2.5 months of operating expenses. The administration feels comfortable in using these funds to cover the shortfall this year. However, we cannot keep tapping into the fund balance. We will need to look at cuts on every level prior to next school year. The shortfall was attributed to the 42 positions that were covered in Federal Education Jobs funding that ended. All but 14-16 positions were covered.

g. Mr. Graham presented a budget of \$2,028,092 for Fund 8 – Other Restricted Funds. Included in this budget is \$1,030,000 for teacher supplements which is not sufficient to cover the \$2,500 supplements given.

Mr. Graham concluded his presentation. He stated the budget for 2012-2013 will be presented to the Vance County Board of Education for approval at the regular meeting on October 8, 2012. He requested Board Members to review the budget and footnotes and to contact him if there were any questions.

Mr. Graham turned the meeting over to Mrs. White who called for questions. There were no questions. Mr. Gregory stated the operation of the school system is tight this year as the previous school year. We cannot continue to pull from the fund balance. It is hoped the economy will turn around and we receive additional funding.

Mrs. White thanked Mr. Graham and everyone who assisted in preparing the budget and Mr. Gregory for his leadership.

4. Being no further business, upon motion by Mrs. Oxendine, second by Ms. Williams, and unanimous (7-0) vote, the Board adjourned at 6:55 p.m.

Building and Grounds Committee Minutes Thursday, September 27, 2012

The Building and Grounds Committee met on Thursday, September 27, 2012, in the Superintendent's Conference Room. Members present were Ruth Hartness, Ronald Kinsley, Dorothy Williams, Ronald E. Gregory, Brian Creasman, Steve Graham and Claiborne Woods. Board Attorney Jerry Stainback attended a portion of the meeting.

Mrs. Hartness called the meeting to order at 8:30 am and followed the agenda.

Mr. Stainback presented the lease agreement between Vance County Schools and Vance County to lease ½ acre of land across the road from New Hope Elementary. This lease will allow the county to erect a water storage tower/tank to help supply potable water for residents in the northern part of the county. **The committee voted to recommend the lease agreement to the full board for approval.** (Attachment #1)

Hite Associates was represented by Jimmy Hite and Brad Williams who provided a power point presentation on the proposal for renovation of the Northern Vance Science labs. The original bid for this work was done in 2008. In 2010 the State adopted new mandatory regulations. Following a brief discussion, Mr. Gregory advised Dr. Creasman, Mr. Woods and Hite Associates to revisit the site and consider recommendations from the Science Department staff and report back to the committee. This visit will occur on October 12th.

The committee reviewed a proposal from Jordan McMillen with Vance County Planning and Development requesting to lease a 50' x 50' corner piece of property at Western Vance for a water meter vault. This installation will not be above ground and will be placed inside a chain link fence. It will also allow the school system to partner with the county again to provide potable water to the citizens in the community. **The committee voted to take this to the full board for approval**. During this discussion, a request was made that Mr. Woods determine if the school system had paid for tap fees at Carver and New Hope elementary schools. (Attachment #2)

Mrs. Hartness brought up the future of the Eaton Johnson two story building and the need for ownership by someone other than the school system as it continues to be a liability. Mrs. Hartness and Mr. Gregory have recently been contacted by Rex Todd who expressed a continued interest in purchasing this property for the same use as originally proposed. Mr. Gregory suggested that we survey our teachers and determine if there is a market for housing within our own organization. This would possibly make a venture with Rex Todd and his organization more attractive.

Mrs. Hartness requested that staff provide the Board with a complete outline of spending for the new STEM project at Northern Vance. She also inquired about the number of vacant mobile units. Mr. Gregory requested the staff gather this information and provide a report. There was also a discussion about the surplus brick from the construction of Clarke Elementary. We will likely keep some for future repairs to the Clarke facility and offer the balance to the Masonry class at Southern Vance. Mr. Gregory suggested that the Masonry class might explore building brick mail box enclosures, residential driveway culvert bridges along with well pump enclosures. This would be great experience and generate funds for their program.

Mr. Woods informed the committee that the final warranty inspection for the multipurpose rooms was due in a couple of months and at that time, the project could be closed. The Northern Vance HVAC Project was previously reported to have been completed in August as proposed and Hite Associates engineer and Gupton Services will begin commissioning of the system.

The regular monthly maintenance updates were included as part of the package. (Attachment #3)

GROUND LEASE

THIS LEASE, made and entered into this the ____ day of _______, 2012, by and between VANCE COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION (hereinafter sometimes referred to as "Lessor") a body politic organized and existing under the laws of the State of North Carolina, party of the first part, and the VANCE COUNTY WATER DISTRICT, (hereinafter sometimes called the "Lessee") a body politic organized and existing under the laws of the State of North Carolina, party of the second part;

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Lessor heretofore acquired the real property hereinafter described for purposes of providing education to the citizens of Vance County; and,

WHEREAS, the Lessee is charged with the construction, operation and maintenance of a public water supply system to the citizens of Vance County located within the Water District; and,

WHEREAS, the Lessee is desirous of constructing, operating and maintaining a water supply tower and associated water lines and utilities related thereto on a portion of land owned by the Lessor; and,

WHEREAS, the Vance County Board of Education has agreed to lease unto the Vance County Water District the tract of land hereinafter described for the purpose set forth herein

NOW, THEREFORE, the Lessor, in consideration of One Dollar (\$1.00) in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, and the covenants and

agreements hereinafter mentioned to be kept and performed by the Lessee, do hereby lease and rent unto the Lessee for a period of ninety-nine (99) years, commencing on the first day of September, 2012, that certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in ______ Township, Vance County, North Carolina, being more particularly described as follows:

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the above-described premises, together with the privileges and appurtenances thereunto belonging unto the Lessee for the period hereinabove mentioned, upon the following terms and conditions:

- 1. The rent during said period shall be One Dollar (\$1.00) per year, which the Lessee agrees to pay in advance on or before the first day of September of each and every year hereafter, beginning on September 1, 2012.
- 2. The Lessee may make alterations and additions to said premises which it may deem necessary for its proper use and enjoyment thereof, provided that such alterations and **additions made** by the Lessee shall not cause any claim or lien to be placed upon the lands without the consent of the Lessor. All such work shall be done in conformity with the rules and regulations of North Carolina and Vance County ordinances. Lessee shall have the right, within a reasonable time after the termination or expiration of this lease, to remove those improvements it so desires from the premises. Lessee shall not be obligated to remove any improvements installed if the Lessee does not so desire.
- 3. The Lessee agrees to make no unlawful or offensive use of the premises, to pay all rents as and when the same shall become due, and to deliver up the same at the end of the term or sooner termination thereof.
- 4. During the term of the Lease, the Lessee shall keep the premises which are to be built upon said property in good repair and generally maintained on so much of the premises as are readily available to be viewed by the general public.
- 5. The Lessor covenants and agrees with the Lessee that subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, the Lessee shall have the right to use and enjoy said premises during the term herein provided for free from any adverse claims from any and all other persons whomsoever.
- 6. This Lease shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the parties hereto, their successors in interest and assigns.

Meter Vault Site Proposal

Vance County, in preparation for Phase 2A and 2B of the Vance County Ph: (252) 738-2091 Water District would like to request from Vance County Schools the Fax: (252) 738-2089 opportunity to acquire 2,500 (50'x50') square feet (0.06 acres) on the west side of Poplar Creek Road and on the Western Vance school property. The ideal location appears to be at the northeastern corner of the property directly along Poplar Creek Road.

While the exact location on the property is not critical, this location would ensure quick and easy access to the site while being located in the least visible location relative to the entire school property. Unlike the water tower site, this site is much smaller and will not have any structures above ground. The purpose of the meter vault site is for a location where the City of Henderson waterline can transition into the Vance County line. The site would be secured by a 6 foot chain link fence, would have a gravel driveway constructed for access and would not have any structures above ground. Once constructed, the meter vault site will allow Vance County to serve property owners from Western Vance School down to US 158 Bypass along Poplar Creek Road.

The County is willing and able to work with the School System to identify an exact location and will provide all of the surveying services and necessary expenses to create the lot should the schools agree. If utilized for the meter vault site, it would ensure that county water can be provided in the northern part of Vance County on the west side of Kerr Lake.

Proposed Arrangement

The County is seeking the ability to enter into a long term lease for the property from Vance County Schools at no cost to the school or the school system, and subject to reasonable restrictions and requests of Vance County Schools.






