Executive Summary

The Henderson Police Department is currently in possession of four (4) Kustom Signal K-55 RADAR units which were originally given to the department as surplus but the NC State Highway Patrol. After several years of use these units have been replaced in the department's vehicles with updated RADAR units and are now obsolete for the use of Speed Enforcement.

The units cannot be disposed of through auction due to the units being a "radiation" emitting device. Mr. Tim Pressley of the NC Department of Justice's Speed Measuring Device Program has offered to have the units returned to NC State property and inventory for the use of training and parts by the RADAR certification personnel. We are requesting to return the four (4) units with the following serial numbers to the State of North Carolina:

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE DONATION OF 4 OBSOLETE KUSTOM SIGNAL K-55 RADAR UNITS TO THE NC DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE SPEED MEASURING DEVICE PROGRAM

- WHEREAS, the Henderson City Council (Council) conducted its Annual Planning Retreat in January 2012, and during said Retreat identified eight Key Strategic Objectives (KSO) and Goals; and
- **WHEREAS**, this Resolution addresses one of the Key Strategic Objectives as follows: **KSO 2:** To Reduce Crime and Provide for a Safe Community; *and*
- **WHEREAS**, the Henderson Police Department received four (4) Kustom Signal K55 Radar Units from the NC State Highway Patrol as surplus equipment in the past; *and*
- **WHEREAS**, these units have been replaced with updated RADAR units and are no longer in use by the Henderson Police Department; *and*
- WHEREAS, Mr. Tim Pressley of the NC Department of Justice has offered to take these units back as surplus property for the State of North Carolina so as to be either reused or disposed of properly; and
- **WHEREAS**, GS §160A-274 authorizes a governmental unit to give personal property to another governmental unit.
- NOW, THERFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HENDERSON CITY COUNCIL THAT IT DOES HEREBY authorize the return of four (4) Kustom Signal K-55 RADARS to the State of North Carolina as surplus.

Mr. Griffin,

Over a year ago I met with you and Gary Daeke about the possibility of joint funding from The City of Henderson, Vance County Schools, and Vance County for tennis court construction at both Northern and Southern Vance High Schools. We have finally locked down some prices designs to best suit our schools and county's needs.

The figure we are trying to reach is a little less that \$350,000.00. We hope to begin aggressively seeking support from our community in the next couple of weeks and plan to raise money for about 90 days. The group of parents and coaches working on the project believe it needs to be done now and not drawn out over a long period of time.
