

### **General Assembly Schedule**

We have been in session over 100 days and still no completed budget. Generally, long session begins in January and ends in June with the passage of a North Carolina biennial budget. School administrators depend on the budget to pay salaries of teacher's as well as teacher's assistants. A balanced budget allows all of the departments within the state to run efficiently. However, the House and the Senate majority leadership are millions of dollars from an agreement.



# HB 566 Amend Eyewitness ID/Showup

<u>HB 566</u> amends the current eyewitness identification act by clarifying that a photo lineup is different from a show-up. HB 566 also establishes procedures for conducting a show-up.

Show-ups are procedures in which an eyewitness is presented with a single live suspect for the purpose of determining whether the eyewitness is able to identify the perpetrator of a crime.

Current law does not address procedures for show-ups, but HB 566 adds that a show-up can only be conduct-





These new procedures have to be developed by The North Carolina Criminal Justice Education and Training Standards Commission. The provisions to be developed include: Standard instructions for eyewitnesses; Confidence statements by the eyewitness (including information related to the eyewitness' vision, the circumstances of the events witnessed, and communications with other eyewitnesses, if any), Training of law enforcement officers specific to conducting show-ups; and any other matters deemed appropriate by the Commission.

# Medicaid Expansion in North Carolina

Medicaid is a joint federal and state program that helps most elderly and low-income people with their medical expenses. The proposed expansion would apply to that group of elderly and low income people who are 50 percent above federal poverty level, but still don't qualify for Medicaid. The program offers assistance with a variety of medical expenses including, but not limited to, preventative care, health screenings and tests, and personal care services. Last year alone our state lost \$2.7 billion of federal Medicaid funding for failing to expand, and the estimates indicate a loss of \$21 billion by the year 2020. Other states that have adopted Medicaid expansion have seen economic growth. In 2014 Washington state and Michigan saved \$105.5 million and \$180 million in medical costs, respectively. If North Carolina does not expand, approximately \$860 million in potential state revenue would be lost and \$161 million in county tax revenue from 2016 to 2020. # Another Extension for the Budget



Majority leaders have for a third straight time, extended the budget deadline requesting a continuing resolution that would give them through September 18, 2015. Issues creating barriers to complete the budget - range from raises for state employees, teachers, keeping teacher's assistants, Medicaid reform, economic incentives, the governor's bond package and the distribution of local sales tax revenue. Failure to adopt a balanced budget is costing taxpayers over \$ 42,000 per weekday for every day it isn't completed.
